The modus operandi always comprises of a participatory approach with the involvement of the beneficiary community and Local Self Governments.

Social Impact Assessment Study is considered to be the process of identifying the social impacts of land acquisition as per The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act 2013 (RFCTLAR&R Act). It is used to predict and mitigate negative impacts and identify opportunities to enhance benefits for affected communities and societies. Rajagiri outREACH has been given the responsibility as the State Level Social Impact Assessment Unit by the Revenue (B) Department, Government of Kerala. This assessment is conducted under the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation, and Resettlement Act 2013.

Rajagiri outREACH is empanelled by Kerala State Revenue (B) Department to conduct Social Impact Studies at State Level and is also empanelled by the District Administration of Pathanamthitta, Kottayam, Idukki, Alappuzha, Ernakulam, Thrissur and Palakkad District to conduct District Level SIA Studies as per Sub-Section (I) of Section 4 of the RFCTLAR&R Act 2013. The SIA Study includes the Survey of the affected persons, Public-Hearing meetings and eventually to submit the report to the concerned District Collectors, Requiring Bodies and other officials.

RAJAGIRI outREACH IS EMPANELLED AS A STATE LEVEL SOCIAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT STUDY UNIT BY REVENUE (B) DEPARTMENT, GOVT. OF KERALA & 7 DISTRICTS. STUDIES WERE CONDUCTED IN ALL 14 DISTRICTS OF KERALA STATE

Since November 2016, **Sixty Six Social Impact Assessment Studies** have been entrusted by Revenue (B) Department, Government of Kerala and Fourteen District Administration, to Rajagiri outREACH. During this reporting period, **15 SIA Studies were sanctioned** out of which **9 State Level Studies** were conducted. **Thirteen SIA Studies** have been completed and the Final Reports have been submitted before the Revenue (B) Department, Government of Kerala and concerned District Administration. **16 Public Hearings** were held in various districts during this pandemic period. A brief summary of different SIA studies conducted in the reporting year of 2020-2021 is furnished below:

1. A. STATE LEVEL EMPANELMENT AS SOCIAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT STUDY UNIT

The affected family members, Officers from the Land Acquisition Office, Requiring Body Official from Public Works Department and Representatives of Social Impact Assessment Unit from Rajagiri outREACH were the participants in the public hearing. Mrs. Meena Kuruvilla, Chairperson SIA Unit had chaired the Public Hearing. Mr. Tony Babu, Rajagiri outREACH, had presented the Draft Report, Mrs. Maria Tency and Mr. Biju C.P., had coordinated the Public Hearing.

Public hearing of the Land Acquisition for the Construction of Kumbalam – Thevara Bridge across Kumbalam Kayal in Elamkulam and Kumbalam Villages, Kanayannoor Taluk of Ernakulam District was held on 19.06.2020 at 11.00 a.m. at Deshya Vayanashala Hall, North Kumbalam, Ernakulam. The affected family members, Officers from the Land Acquisition Office, Requiring Body Official from Public Works Department and Representatives of Social Impact Assessment Unit from Rajagiri outREACH were the participants in the public hearing. They aim to provide financial assistance, technical and professional support to needy and eligible women to become micro-entrepreneurs and thus making them self-reliant and self-sustainable.

Paul Foundation focuses on Women Entrepreneurship activities like Jewellery making, drums making, goat/cow rearing, DTP, snacks making, flour mill, candle making, flower making, etc. There are 614 Women Beneficiaries in 614 units under this project. During this reporting period, the beneficiaries were supported to initiate Entrepreneurship in Beauty parlour, coconut oil making, pappadam making, ornamental fish farming, tailoring, grass gardening, poultry farming, mushroom cultivation, broom making, quail poultry farming, provisions shop, cake baking unit, serial lights unit, DTP Centre, cow / goat rearing, pig farming, fish farming, jasmine flower nursery, catering, mobile fish and vegetable unit and other such activities.

It is now that education plays an important role, which makes them responsible human beings. In the process of socialization education, observation and imitation plays a crucial role in the development of the child.

It reached out to the deserving children who were economically poor or from broken families. Through the child and higher education scholarship program initiated by Rajagiri outREACH, **2759 children** were supported during this reporting period. 
4. B. CHILD EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMME UNDER CORPORATES






The parents were very supportive and encouraging to the students. Sofna K.K's parent, Smt. Jasmine remarked that it helped to improve the learning skills and other activities








Online Children's Meeting

Online Children's meetings were conducted on a monthly basis with an aim of gathering all the children on a public forum especially on Saturdays and other public holidays. They received an opportunity to discuss their study matters, family problems, and also attended classes conducted by experts in their respective fields. In the present scenario, it has been found that children spend a lot of their time in watching Television, usage of mobile, sleeping and in short it can be generalized that children on these days aren't spending their valuable time productively. The classes and programmes that were conducted from time to time had benefited them to sensitize the value of time and to nurture their skills and talents. Due to **COVID-19** Pandemic situation we had to omit the offline classes in this reporting period.


Although there were certain limitations during this pandemic, Rajagiri outREACH Staff were able to give online classes and tele-counseling to the children and their families. Moreover, Rajagiri outREACH published COVID-19 special magazine which includes the activities done by children during the Pandemic lockdown, like poetry, bottle art, cooking, growing crops, stitching masks, drawings, and other creative works at the five centers under the sponsorship of Geojit Financial Services Ltd. Subsequently, by practicing those activities many of them were able to make their routine meaningful and fruitful in this COVID-19 pandemic situation. Mask Production by Sponsorship Families with the Support of Geojit Financial Services Ltd.

Rajagiri outREACH in association with Geojit Financial Services Ltd., engaged the mothers of sponsored children to stitch masks for distribution at 5 panchayats namely Pothanikkad, Paingottoor, Budhannur, Perumanna and Vadakarapathy. 

Rajagiri outREACH in association with Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, had distributed 9 Televisions to the Tribal Children who were studying in Pinavoorkudi Tribal Government School of Kuttampuzha Panchayat, Ernakulam District on 22.07.2020. Shri. Dean Kuriakose M.P., Idukki District had inaugurated the distribution of TV's to the tribal children in the presence of Fr. Shinto Joseph CMI – Assistant Director – Rajagiri College of Social Sciences and Mrs. Meena Kuruvilla – Project Director – Rajagiri outREACH.

Kaval is the project initiated by Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Kerala for the betterment of the children in conflict with law. The project was launched in 2017, in Trivandrum, Kozhikode and Palakkad districts, and it has now been expanded to all the 14 districts in Kerala. Kaval is being implemented by the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) of Women and Child Department, Government of Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram, in association with the National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS) Bangalore.

Rajagiri outREACH has been empanelled as an NGO as per the Order No. ICPS 3/9665/17 (1) dated 05/10/2017 issued by Director, Social Justice Department to implement the Kaval Project in Ernakulam District. Kaval Project of Rajagiri outREACH is working under the supervision of District Child Protection Unit and the other supporting authorities are Juvenile Justice Board, CWC, Police, Excise and Observation Homes. Kaval Project of Ernakulam District was launched officially on February 03, 2018 at Government Observation Home, Kakkanad. During the period 2020-21, Juvenile Justice Board had assigned **91** children who were in conflict with law to the Kaval Project of Rajagiri outREACH.

Rajagiri outREACH has also been empanelled by Department of Women and Child Development, Govt. of Kerala as per the Order No. ICPS 3/684/20 dated 14.09.2020 to implement the Kaval Project in Thrissur District.

I. ACTIVITIES OF RAJAGIRI outREACH KAVAL PROJECT, ERNAKULAM

Nature of the Project Activities

The process of the project runs like this; the list of the children in conflict with the law is issued by the JJB and forwarded to the DCPU. With the recommendation the DCPU gives charge of the children to the NGOs. The Programme Coordinator and the Social Worker conduct home visits to each children and administer a questionnaire in order to identify the problem areas of the child. Once a rapport is established with the child, his/her family, the police station, school, the support is provided as per the need of the child. So the child may not fall back into the crime situations any longer.

Kaval Programme – Rajagiri outREACH deals with the children in conflict with law in the District of Ernakulam - Rural. Initially there were 51 cases handed over from the Juvenile Justice Board, more children were added on and presently the total number of children has reached to 91, till March 2021.

The home visit and the officevisit will help the Kaval team for building the rapport and continuation of the follow-up.

COVID 19- Lockdown Relief Activities by Rajagiri outREACH Kaval Team

The world is reeling from the COVID-19 crisis and the vulnerable segments of our society are mostly at risk, thus KAVAL Rajagiri outREACH staff had worked under special circumstances during lockdown in an innovative way since the team was not allowed to go for field work. Instead of regular home visits and group works Kaval team had focused on telecounselling and contacted each child and conducted a variety of lockdown activities (KAVAL KALARI) to engage the children and to develop their talents in different fields such as writing, reading, dancing, acting and skill exhibiting in sports and arts and many more. Also the Kaval Team had taken part in State Level Meetings through video conferencing to discuss about various activities for children.

Purpose: To have a discussion and prepare case studies to prepare a report regarding the issue of CCLs with high risk on 25/04/2020



During the lockdown period Rajagiri outREACH Kaval team had contacted all the children and enquired about their wellbeing and ensured their safety, Kaval team had provided COVID-19 awareness sessions for 60 CCLs, telecounselling for 54 CCLs, family counselling for 9 children, police support for 4 children, legal support for 2 children and follow-up of deaddiction treatment for 2 children. During the lockdown period, special service was given to CCLs who had escaped from the observation home. Timely intervention by Kaval staff and proper networking with authorities including Info Park Police, JJB members, OH Counsellor and CCLs family, helped to get them back safe.

Apart from official works, Kaval team were also involved in rejuvenating activities conducted by State Kaval team for Kaval staffs, and Rajagiri Kaval team had achieved second prize.

Life Skills Education

Life-Skills Education as defined by the UNICEF "a behavior change or behavior development approach to address a balance of three areas; knowledge, attitude and skills"

The skills that make an individual adjust and adapt to the changes and challenges brought to them on an everyday basis are known as life skills. Some examples of life skills are effective communication, decision making, critical thinking, problem-solving, making connections etc. These are an essential set of skills that is learned by a kid throughout their life to enhance their lifestyle in a better way possible. Learning a life skill is a very important and mandatory part of growing up.

In everyday life, the development of life skills helps to:-

- Find new ways of thinking and problem solving.
- Recognize the impact of their actions and teaches them to take responsibility for what they do rather than blame others.
- Build confidence both in spoken skills and for group collaboration and cooperation.
- Develop a greater sense of self-awareness and appreciation for others.

The KAVAL team had conducted life skill education session on 28th March 2021. During the session total eight children had participated and they actively cooperated. The children had no idea about what was life skill and the importance for life skill in everyday life. Through the session the children were educated on the importance of life skill in everyday life.



Rajagiri outREACH is the Child Line Support Organization in Malappuram District. Rajagiri outREACH provides Child Abuse Case Interventions, Awareness Programmes, Outreach Activities and Open-house Programmes, Protection of Child Rights, etc.

Childline is a national, 24 hour emergency telephonic helpline in order to provide care and protection to children who are in need. The Nodal office of child line is set up at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences and a Support Organization of Childline is set up at Malappuram District. Childline covers schools, anganawadis and residential areas to identify issues faced by children and find solutions for the same. 




Two projects sanctioned by National Institute of Social Defence (NISD), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, New Delhi had commenced operations during June 2020 under the umbrella of Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery, viz., **Outreach & Drop In Centre (ODIC) at Ernakulam & Community Based Peer Led Intervention (CPLI) at Kozhikode**, based on **“Focused Intervention Programmes under National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction”**.

National Institute of Social Defence (NISD) under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India empanelled Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, Kalamassery, Cochin, Kerala to implement Outreach Drop-In Centre Project in Ernakulam District, Kerala as per the order F.No.45/270/2019 NCDAP/NAPPDR/TI/(ODIC) dated 22.01.2020.

Outreach Drop-In Centre Project (ODIC) office is located in Koonamavu, Kottuvally Grama Panchayath, Ernakulam District, Kerala. The Outreach Drop-In Centre Project (ODIC) team has identified Varapuzha and Kottuvally Panchayat as the hotspots in Ernakulam district as referred by the Police and Excise departments, Ernakulam. The team came to know that most of the cases in the district are being reported here.

The Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team comprises of a Centre In-charge-cum Counsellor who is in-charge of supervising the centre activities, setting up a routing monitoring mechanism or supervision of outreach works and three Outreach workers who are responsible for visiting community and hotspots, distributing IEC material in the community, maintaining documentation/records and a Part-time Doctor for the treatment of substance dependent clients and advising for investigation and referral.

Even though the Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Project was sanctioned on 22.01.2020, the activities and services of the project were initiated from 1st June 2020 due to the Covid-19 Pandemic situation.

Activities of Outreach Drop In- Centre Project from 1st June 2020 to 31st March 2021

1.1 Mapping of Substance Use Hotspots

Outreach Drop-In Centre Project team had conducted social mapping at Kottuvally and Varappuzha Grama Panchayaths in Ernakulam district. Kottuvally Grama Panchayath have 22 wards and Varappuzha Grama Panchayath have 16 wards. All panchayath wards were divided between the 3 ORWs for conducting social mapping. Outreach Workers prepared social mapping of assigned wards with the support of Anganwadi teachers, Kudumbashree Members, representatives from community and local self-government authorities like Panchayat members. A map of the respective ward was drawn and major hotspots (where drug- users gather or use stuff) were marked.

Outreach Drop-In Centre Team could reach the substance users by preparing the social mapping of substance use hotspots and provided services such as one to one sessions, group works and doctor's consultation to the users.

Social mapping became an integral part in identifying the main spots of drugexchange, type of substances which were excessively used by the youth and children in that area, modeand pattern of use. Kottuvally and Varappuzha Panchayath contains rivers and backwaters, which is an advantageous environment for the substance users to find out the spots such as riversides, play grounds, waste lands and unused buildings to use and exchange drugs. **ODIC Team had identified 31 hotspots in Kottuvally Panchayath and 26 hotspots in Varappuzha Panchayath.**

1.2. Community Awareness Programs Conducted on Prevention of Substance Use during the Period 2020-2021

Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences Kalamassery, Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had conducted awareness programs for the prevention of drug use and abuse in the community among all categories of people. These programs were conducted for Kudumbasree members, Anganwadi workers, MGNREGA members, Youth Club members School students, Police officers, Drug user’s parents, Panchayath committee members, CITU Members, ICDS supervisors, Balasabha members and various other community members. These programs aims to increase awareness of community people regarding drug usage and related health risks. By maintaining the Covid Protocol, ODIC team had conducted **43** community awareness programs in Kottuvally and Varappuzha Grama Panchayaths during the period 2020-2021. In addition to that Outreach Drop-In Centre Team had conducted **5** programmes for the child sponsorship students. A total of **47 community awareness programmes** were conducted by the ODIC Team.


1.3. Distribution of IEC Material

1.4. Linkage with other Stake Holders

1.6. Social Mapping

1.7. Screening and Assessment

Outreach Workers (ORW) had completed entire assessments of 280 substance users like Initial assessment, Baseline assessment, WHO tool during the period 2020-2021. Most of the clients were identified by the outreach workers through the linkage with stakeholders and participants of community awareness sessions. After identifying the need of the client, outreach workers provided the counselling sessions, house visits, group sessions, doctor’s consultation and referrals. Also updated their status in counselling register and Service delivery register. Each outreach worker in the centre motivate and encourage the substance users to visit Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) office and seek Outreach Workers (ORWs) and Doctor’s help whenever their services were required. Screenings of Drug users (DU’s) are recorded in screening record and each Drug users (DU’s) have referral IDs so that Outreach Workers (ORWs) can keep confidentiality of their clients.

1.8. Behavioral Change Communication

Behavior Change Communication (BCC) is a communication strategy which encourages individual / community to change their behavior. It is a strategy that triggers people/society/communities to adopt healthy, beneficial and positive behavioral practices. BCC is an effective communication approach which helps to promote changes in knowledge, attitudes, norms, beliefs and behaviors.

In Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Project, Outreach Workers used **one to one sessions and Group sessions** as the strategies for behavior change communication with the clients.

1.9. One to One Sessions

The Outreach Worker helped and assisted the Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) In-charge, there by ensured that all activities of the ODIC office are conducted as per the schedule and plan. The outreach worker assessed and addressed the needs of the community and identified substance users individually or as a group to help them to resolve their own problems and needs, recognize what solutions can be used to address their problems with their own resources combined with outside support.

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Team conducted **435 one to one sessions** during the period of 2020- 2021. Through the one to one sessions, Outreach workers identified the drug users who need doctor's consultation, individual counselling and family counselling and provided those services according to their need. The services provided to each clients are clearly recorded in the corresponding files.

1.10. Group Sessions

Group sessions were a major factor in identifying and addressing the needs of drug users during the period 2020-2021. Outreach Drop-In Centre team enriched the client groups with the information of time

management, life skills and side effects of drug addiction through the group work sessions. Also focused group discussions helped the outreach workers to understand the type of substances used by the clients, mode and pattern of use and risk behaviours in clients. In group sessions, Outreach Workers monitored the drug users individually and identified their behaviour patterns in a group for further behavioural interventions. These behaviour interventions such as psycho-education, behavioural therapy and motivational enhancement therapy helped the substance users to actively participate in their recovery from substance abuse and addiction and enhanced their ability to resist substance use.

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team conducted **12 group work sessions** with substance users during the period 2020-2021.

1.11. Doctor's Consultation at Rajagiri outREACH ODIC Office for Substance Users

After identifying substance users from the community, Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had provided doctor's consultation at Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Office. Assessment and diagnosis of the substance users would be carried out by the doctor, and counsellor of the Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC). Assessments which are recorded on the initial visit of the client are: basic medical history, information on the type of substance, mode and patterns of use, abstinence attempts in the past, help or treatment sought earlier and other risk behaviours.

Dr. Sanju George, Part-time Doctor of Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) who have years of experience in handling substance dependant clients visit the centre weekly. Young people seek medical (Psychiatric) care at ODIC for several mental health problems such as depression, anxiety, conduct disorders, psychosis and substance misuse. Some young people also suffer from several of the above psychiatric disorders, further complicated by dysfunctional psychosocial circumstances.

The range of medical (psychiatric) interventions provided include Pharmacotherapy for depression, anxiety etc., and de-addiction treatment (Community-Based) for treatment of withdrawal from psychiatric substances. Where necessary, we refer patients for intensive in-patient de-addiction treatment and hospital based rehabilitation. Many of the young people are managed well in their homes (and communities) or medications. It is found that medications improve the short – term and long – term outcomes in substance misuse and often mental health disorders. **38 substance users consulted the Doctor** at Rajagiri outREACH ODIC Office during the period 2020- 2021.

1.12. Referral Services

Based on the assessment of Outreach Worker and 4 of the clients were referred to Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church Medical College (MOSC) Medical College, Kolencherry for de- addiction treatment, S.H Hospital Painkulam and Mindful Rejuvenation Centre for De- addiction Angamaly.

1.13. Drop In Centre Facility for Drug Users

ODIC office has all the facilities like recreation room, counselling room and medical room for the drug users. ODIC is also equipped to provide outpatient treatment services for substance use related issues and psychiatric treatment support.

1.14. Medical Camp

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had conducted Free Medical Camp on 8th December 2020 from 10.30 am to 12.30 pm at Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Office. Medical camp was organised with the support of Rajagiri outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, SURAKSHA Project CAPS IDU.

Medical Camp was conducted for the DU's of Kottuvally Panchayat. HIV/AIDS test was conducted and, BP, Temperature, Weight, Height of the clients were measured. Almost **15 members** had participated in the Medical Camp.

1.15. Individual, Group and Family Counselling

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Office had provided Individual, group and family counselling for substance users. The counsellor helped and assisted the substance users to retrospect what was the reason and cause behind the intake of substances and gave awareness on the negative impacts of these drugs. Counsellor gave intervention which will improve their condition and lead a positive life style. The interventions which were provided to each client were recorded in counselling register based on the 24- hour rule, that is the documentation of the counselling interventions given by the Outreach Worker (ORW) in the register within 24 hours after the counselling. In each counselling session the Outreach Worker (ORW) follow the counselling principles and skills which will enhance the counselling process. Family counselling are provided when the ORW visits the house of the client or when the family members visit the office. Interventions of family counselling are recoded in the family session register.

1.16. House Visits

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had conducted **57 house visits** during the period 2020- 2021. The Outreach Workers had maintained regular contact with the substance user's parents and family counselling were provided during the house visits by Outreach Workers.

1.17. Follow-up Sessions for Substance Users

With the objective to make the best possible intervention among the substance users, Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had conducted continuous follow-up of drug users. It helps to know about the client's stages of change and reduce the possibility of relapse. Outreach Workers keep a follow-up format in office. Outreach Workers (ORWs) conducted follow-ups through phone calls and house visits. In each follow-up, Outreach Workers had provided interventions according to the client's status related to the substance use.

30 Follow-up sessions were conducted during the period of 2020-2021 by Outreach Workers.

1.18. Other Activities Conducted By Odic Team

1.18.1. Webinar

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had conducted webinar on 30th July 2020 on the topic '**The connection between Mental Illness and Substance Abuse among Children**'. The webinar was inaugurated by Fr. Shinto Joseph CMI MPhil, Assistant Director, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, the welcome address was delivered by Mrs. Meena Kuruvilla Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Project Director. Resource Persons for the webinar were Special Juvenile Police Inspector Mr. Ashraf, Child Line Kochi Director, Fr. Jenson Variyath and Dr. Ajith Paul Deson, Advisory Board Member of IMA-MSN Kerala. Total number of **102 participants** had attended in the session.

1.18.2. Poster Making Competition

ODIC team conducted an Inter Collegiate Poster Making Competition about '**Anti-drug among children**' on 1st August 2020. The competition was conducted on an online platform. The winners were selected by an Art Teacher and 5 posters were published in ODIC Facebook page, and cash prizes were distributed to the winners: 1st prize: Georgie Jacob Kaippallil – II MSW (Rs.1000/-), 2nd prize: Helen Mary Bob – III BBA (Rs.750/-), 3rd prize: Annriya Jaison – III BSW (Rs.500/-). O DIC Around **10 students** had participated in the competition.

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had conducted awareness session for drug users' parents at Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) office Koonamavu on 21st February 2021 from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. The topic of the session was **“Influence of parents on substance abuse and legal issues”**. Inspector of Police- Mr. Sajeev Kumar had inaugurated the programme and gave awareness about the drugs and recent incidents related to drug abuse. Assistant Sub Inspector of Police Mr. Renil Varghese also gave a talk about the recent cases and how the youth get addicted to drugs. Women Civil Excise Officer of Excise Range Office Aluva- Mrs. Dhanya K.J. had given awareness about types of drugs and legal issues related to drugs.

Mrs. Dhanya also discussed about the parents's experience in the session which helped others to understand the danger in the usage of drugs. 14 parents had participated in the programme.

1.19. Staff Capacity Building Sessions conducted during the Period 2020-2021

Capacity building is a systematic process to improve employees' knowledge, skills, understanding, values, attitude, motivation, and capability necessary to perform well at work. Capacity building is a core component to enhance the employees' performance.

Outreach Drop-in Centre (ODIC) Centre In-Charge conducted Staff capacity building thrice in a month. During each session the Centre-In charge had given lectures on the subjects which are related to the Outreach Drop-in Centre (ODIC) Project. After each session, Outreach Workers (ORWs) had prepared a report of the session and attached to the file for capacity building reports. Capacity building sessions helped the outreach workers to get knowledge about various topics. These topics were included in the awareness session thereby outreach workers could provide more information on the topic related to substance use.

A total of **10 capacity building sessions** were conducted by the Centre-In Charge during the period 2020-2021.

1.20. Training attended by ODIC Team Organized by National Institute of Social Defence, Government of India

The National Institute of Social Defence is the Nodal Training and Research Institute in the field of social defence. Though social defence covers the entire gamut of activities and programmes for the protection of society, it is currently focusing on human resource development in the areas of drug abuse prevention, welfare of senior citizens and transgenders, beggary prevention, and other social defence issues.

NISD provided training to Outreach workers and Counsellors of ODIC every month on the subjects related to ODIC Project. ORWs and Centre-In charge had attended the training and prepared reports of the session. From each session outreach workers learned lot of new information on the topics related to substance abuse and these topics were discussed in the community awareness sessions.

1.21. Exposure Visits by ODIC Team

Exposure visits are a very important training methodology as it enables the participants from a different setting to interact with and learn from each other, allowing them to view practical/real life situations of successful integration of sustainable practices.

ODIC Team had conducted **3 exposure visits** during the period of 2020-2021.

1.21.1. Exposure visit to CAPS Project Vytala

ORWs had visited CAPS Project, Vytala on 21st October 2020 at 10 AM as part of the exposure visit. Kerala AIDS Control Society had implemented CAPS Project in 2008. The aim of the project is to reduce the sharing habit of IDU and reduce harmful effect of injected drug use. Oral substitution Therapy is the important strategy used in CAPS project. CAPS provide Doctor's consultation, counselling, OST therapy and free oral drugs. The project provides services to 514 IDUs. Targeted intervention and OST are the two parts of the project. Targeted intervention includes Project Director, Monitoring and Evaluation Officer. Monitoring and Evaluation Officer Mr. Jerry introduced the project and activities. ODIC team had interacted with an IDU and he discussed his experiences. He discussed about injecting drugs, its symptoms and its local names.

After the session ODIC team had visited OST (Oral Substitution Therapy) room and pharmacy. Mr. Jerry exhibited the drugs and discussed the pattern of distribution.

1.21.2. Exposure visit to SWANTHAM Protective and Rehabilitation Home, Pathadipalam

ODIC team had conducted exposure visit to SWANTHAM Protective and Rehabilitation Home, Pathadipalam on 12th October 2020 at 10.30 AM. Project Manager Mr. Qathab had introduced the project. SWANTHAM is a community-based organization, which provides services for sex workers like HIV/AIDS test, Condom distribution and awareness on safe sex.

1.21.3. Exposure visit to Nirmal Nikethan Mukthisadan, Pookkattupady

Outreach Drop-In Centre team had visited Nirmal Nikethan Mukthisadan on 25th March 2021 at 2 pm. Nirmal Nikethan Mukthisadan is a major voluntary organization that started in 1989 for the prohibition activities and de-addiction programmes with the major objective of uplifting economically, culturally and educationally. It avows 30 years of triumphant legacy and has the clarion call of treating the deviances at physical, psychological, familial, social and spiritual domains of alcohol addicts. Substance De-Addiction Programme is an inpatient short-stay treatment of 28 to 30 days.

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had reached Mukthisadan centre at 02.00 pm as per the appointment from the Project Director. Initially, Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had met the Counsellor, Mrs. Afra Shajahan, and she gave a brief introduction about the activities of Mukthisadan. After that, Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team had interacted with the Project Director and Senior Counsellor, they explained all activities of Mukthisadan. Mukthisadan provide a total of 50 beds for the inmates. (15 beds under IRCA project).

1.23.2. Weekly Meeting

Weekly meetings were presided by the Centre-In Charge of ODIC. The activities done by Outreach Workers during the last week will be discussed and assessed by the Centre-In charge. Outreach workers submit their daily dairies and weekly plan during every weekly meeting before the Centre-In charge. Each Outreach Workers (ORW) should make a plan for the week and it will be discussed in the weekly meeting. **26 weekly meetings** were conducted by Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) in the period of 2020-2021.

1.24. COVID-19 Cell Committee

Drug abuse is a global phenomenon which affects an individual, family and society. The addiction to drugs is one of the major causes of human distress and anguish; the increase in crime and violence worldwide is a consequent of the massive illegal production and distribution of drugs. As of today, there is no part of the world that is free from the curse of drug trafficking and drug addiction. As a country, India is also caught in this circle of massive drug abuse and drug trafficking which is seemingly affecting the young generation and thereby disturbing the chain of productivity in the progress and development of the country. Late childhood and adolescence are periods of experimentation, exploration, identity formation, risk taking, and assertion for independence in every person's life. Naturally, the incidence of drug abuse in children and adolescents is higher than the general population.

f. Field Visits

The trainers conducted field visits as a part of community training, and home visits of Peer Educators. The trainers had visited the 23rd and 26th divisions on 9th, 19th and 20th of March 2021.

g. Community Training

h. Peer Educators (PE) Review Meeting and Documentation



Most of the Women Entrepreneurs were badly impacted due to COVID-19. To engage the women beneficiaries, Rajagiri outREACH had involved 50 women entrepreneurs in making mask, PP suit kit making, provided free food kits to the needy ones both for the public welfare and also as a source of income during the lockdown period. Most of the women made these masks mainly for a private firm some of the women involved in making masks for the Kudumbasree, panchayath, parish, residence association and for their own neighbours. They also made 2100 masks for KP Paul project. Rajagiri outREACH Staff provided psychosocial support and counselling for the women beneficiaries during the COVID-19 pandemic period.



Under the 13th phase of the K.P. Paul Foundation project, a selection interview was arranged on 29th January 2021 in the Jubilee Mandiram Hall of the Nadathara Gramapanchayath, Thrissur District. The interview board included Mr. Johny N. V., G.M. Service representing K. P. Paul Foundation and Smt. Meena Kuruvilla, Project Director, Smt. Ligi V.E., Coordinator, and Smt. Divya from Rajagiri outREACH.. Around 76 members attended the interview, carrying with them the application form, house visit form and bank account details. The applicants had mainly applied for loans for business such as cow, goat, buffalo and fish rearing, mushroom cultivation, snacks making, vegetable farming, tailoring, catering unit, small petty shops, candle making, soap making, renovating cow and goat shed, rubber band making and for computer. The various questions that been asked were their experience, reason for the loan, how to get their raw materials, cost of raw materials, estimated income per day and estimated loan amount for their project. The selection team had analyzed the communication skills, technical skills and also knowledge for the demand of their product in the market or nearby shop. Among the 76 applicants 47 applicants were short listed. After the house visits, 41 beneficiaries were finalized.

The official launch of the 13th Phase of CSR initiatives for Women Entrepreneurship Programme “**Creating an Entrepreneur**” under K. P. Paul Foundation was initiated during this reporting period by Rajagiri outREACH. The Project had expanded to **470 Beneficiaries**. A total of **Rs.19,25,000** (Rupees Nineteen Lakhs Twenty Five Thousand only) was directly bestowed to **41 new beneficiaries** during the reporting period, by K.P. Paul Foundation, to start entrepreneurship like Goat, Buffalo and Cow rearing, Farming, Poultry, Cow shed and cow dung pit, Tailoring, Expansion of provision shop, food products, catering unit, pappad making unit, Broom making, Purchase of machineries and Materials in flour mill, Food products making, maintenance of beauty parlour, Cake Making, purchase of utensils in catering unit, purchasing a double machine for tailoring and to the maintenance of existing shop room and starting a stationery shop, etc. The women were provided with training on book keeping and accounts, capacity building, public relations, communication skills and team management.

Those who were interested in the project had submitted their application before 20th January 2021 to the Kudumbashree office.

House visit and interview

In the month of January and February 2021 Rajagiri outREACH staff had visited 260 houses in Annamanada Gramapanchayath. Panchayat President and CDS Chairperson had assisted the staff to collect the applications from all the wards.

Under the 14th phase of the K.P. Paul Foundation project, a selection interview was conducted on 9th March 2021 for the 14th phase of the K.P. Paul Foundation Women Entrepreneurship Project, at the Panchayath Hall Annamanada, Thrissur. The interview board consisted of Smt. Meena Kuruvilla, Project Director, Smt. Ligi V.E., Coordinator, and Smt. Divya Rajesh from Rajagiri outREACH and the K P Paul Foundation were represented by Mr. Johny N. V., GM Service. A total of 250 members had attended the interview. The various questions that had been asked were their experience, purpose of the loan, how the raw materials would be acquired, the cost of the raw materials, estimated income per day and the estimated amount of loan required for their project. The communication skills, technical skills and also knowledge about the demand for their product in the market or nearby shops were also analyzed. Among the 250 applicants, 147 of them were short listed. After the revisit to their houses, 144 beneficiaries were finalized for obtaining the loan for their respective entrepreneurial business

The official launch of the 14th Phase of CSR initiatives for Women Entrepreneurship Programme “**Creating an Entrepreneur**” under K. P. Paul Foundation was initiated during this reporting period by Rajagiri outREACH. The Project had expanded to **614 Beneficiaries**. A total of **Rs. 48,55,000.00 (Rupees Forty Eight Lakhs fifty five thousand only) were distributed to 144 beneficiaries on 20th March 2021** during the reporting period, by K.P. Success Story – Women Entrepreneurship Sponsored by K.P. Paul Foundation

Success Story of Jini Babu



Jini Babu (Challisery Penika (H)) is a 33 year old lady and a mother of two boys studying in 10th and 7th standard residing in Kodakara Panchayath Thrissur District. Her husband is a painter and her mother also resides with her. She had started her tailoring unit with just one stitching machine in one room of her own house. She is a fashion designer. Later in the year 2017 she came to know about the K.P Paul Foundation Loan through Rajagiri outREACH, and with the desire to expand her business she had taken the loan.

Jini had taken a loan amount of Rs.50,000/- which she had utilized to purchase more machines and built a room at the top of her own house to expand her stitching classes to more students. She had started giving classes for 10 students for 2 hours in a day as well as classes on stitching, hand embroidery and painting classes for women. Jini was able to connect with the women in the community very easily because she is one among them. She was able to achieve a profit from her

stitching unit. She was able to utilize the profit for the education of the children, pay back the loan amount and also she was able to buy materials for stitching and meet other expenses that comes from the business. She has now 10 students whom she teaches fashion designing. By teaching the women in the same community she is empowering the women in the community and also setting them as a role model and encouraging them to earn for themselves. Through her tailoring unit she was able to offer job opportunities to 26 women from the same community and thus enabled those 26 ladies to earn for themselves and also to empower them.

She also does piece work and hand embroidery work for marriages and she also get orders of uniform stitching from various schools. As the year passes the reach ability of her tailoring unit had increased and the women in the community had started reaching out to her for doing stitching and embroidery works for various functions also more number of students had started to enroll with her to learn stitching lessons thus she was able to achieve a profit from her tailoring unit and it helped her to improve the living standard of her and the family members and also she was able to help her husband in meeting the needs of the family. At times when her husband was not having daily job she was able to meet the needs of the family with the money she got from her tailoring unit. She was also able to take care of her mother all by herself with the money she earned. During COVID-19 pandemic period, she was able to take classes for her students through online mode and also she was able to earn money during this difficult situation by stitching PPE kits and masks in bulk quantity. Her business had helped her to improve her confidence and willpower and support from the family members had helped her to continue her dream. She has the confidence to tell the public that she owns a tailoring unit named **‘Dreams’**.


We see how social factors have placed the responsibility on women to be the sole caretaker of the household chores. Juggling between workplace and housework is not an easy task. It actually puts a lot

About Session 4

Adv. Teena Cherian had started her session with a motto “***A Healthy Work Place for Better Mental Health***”

- ↗ Work is good for Mental Health but a negative environment can lead to physical and Mental Health problem. Depression and anxiety have a significant economic impact and will lead to loss in productivity. Harassment and bullying at work are commonly reported problems and can have a substantial adverse impact on mental health.
- ↗ Persons suffering from Mental Health issues can be considered as a disabled person.
- ↗ Every person with a disability has the right to work, should be treated equally and should not be discriminated against and should be provided with support in the workplace.



About Session 5

Rev. Dr. Fr. Saju M.D.CMI, Associate Director and Vice Principal, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), Kalamassery, Kerala and Mental Health Professional, had started his session on the topic: **“Workplace Mental Health and Psycho Social Interventions”**

- ↗ Work, including working conditions, is one of the key social determinants of mental health
- ↗ 15% to 30% of workers experiences some form of mental health problem during their working lives.

The Day Care Centre for the Elderly, is a non-institutional scheme namely **Pakalveedu** for the elderly, mainly functioning in Ernakulam District at Kothad, Kadamakkudy and Binanipuram. “Pakalveedukal” are functioning under the patronage of various Corporates, LSG’s, clubs, organizations, etc.

The emphasis is on non-institutional and Community Based Services (CBS) with the intention of integrating the elderly with the community. The purpose and basic principle of the approach is to assist the elderly who experience isolation, rejection and suffer from insecurity, anxiety and depression. The programme supports 350 elderly people through different centers. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic period and protocol the regular activities of the day care which included news paper reading, discussion on local reports, personal sharing, feature films shown on elders related issues, house visits, exposure visits, entertainment trips, reading, listening to music, games and yoga, counselling, motivational and awareness classes on health, relationships, etc., celebration of members’ birthdays, nutritious lunch, observation of occasions like International Elders’ Day, Gandhi Jayanthi, Onam, Ramzan, Christmas & New Year, Environment Day, were restricted but most of the programmes / activities were organized by Rajagiri outREACH Staff through online meetings/telecounselling. The service of a doctor once a week is provided at certain centers. The social workers from Rajagiri outREACH paid house visits to Pakalveedu members on regular basis to provide psycho social support and for providing food and health provision to the senior citizens.

Our first Senior Citizen Day Care Center (Pakalveedu) was established in Kothad Village in Ernakulam District in the year 1997. Currently the centers are functioning at Kothad, Kadamakudy and Binanipuram.

The major programs conducted through the offline / online platform to the Pakalveedu Members were:

- International day for the Elderly
- Psycho Social Support / Telecounselling
- Class about old age care
- E-Observation of important festivals and days
- Class on Nutritious food
- Distribution of Food and Health Provision Kits
- Distribution of Immunity Booster Homeo Medicine
- Coordinating of COVID-19 vaccination camps

a. ACTIVITIES OF PAKALVEEDU AT KOTHAD



Jalanidhi is an integrated water supply and sanitation project undertaken by Government of Kerala, implemented by **Kerala Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (K.R.W.S.A)** with the financial assistance of World Bank. The project is being implemented in selected Grama Panchayaths (GPs) with effective community participation. The key stakeholders in the project are Grama Panchayath (GP), Beneficiary Group (BG), Supporting Organization (SO) and the KRWSA with a unique cost sharing system. Rajagiri outREACH, Kalamassery has implemented Jalanidhi projects in two Grama Panchayaths i.e. Kunnanthanam Grama Panchayath in Pathanamthitta District and Arakulam Grama Panchayath in Idukki District. In these Grama Panchayaths, Supporting Organization is providing Community Development and Technical Assistance to the BGs as well as conducting Grama Sabhas, Training Programmes, Water Day and Environment Day Programmes, Women Empowerment Programmes, GP Level Ground Water Recharging Programmes, etc., as part of the project implementation.

Rajagiri outREACH is the implementing agency for Suraksha projects functioning at Ernakulam and Perumbavoor sanctioned by Kerala State AIDS Control Society (KSACS), Government of Kerala and has been working for migrant labourers since September 2008. Along with HIV/AIDS prevention programme, health camps, health education, high risk group identification, STI screening, counseling, ICTC, mega events, exhibitions, film shows, World AIDS Day observation, COVID-19 Relief Activities, etc. were conducted to prevent problems in health, sanitation, livelihood and hygiene. The main objective of this project is to reduce HIV/AIDS prevalence in Kerala targeting migrants who are residing in Ernakulam District. The project has reached out to **16143** migrants through contacts in the STI clinics and the group meetings in labour camps during the period.

8. B. SURAKSHA MIGRANT PROJECT ACTIVITIES AT KALAMASSERY

Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant project had commenced operations on 15th September 2008. The target population is migrants who are mainly employed in construction and industrial sector. Ernakulam is a place in Kerala where major construction and industrial works take place and it is a destination for the highest number of migrant laborers from other states namely West Bengal, Bihar, Orissa, Jharkhand, Tamil Nadu, Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh. Over four and half years of active intervention among the migrant population has made us realize that a good percentage of the migrants are having high risk behavior and they are vulnerable to STIs and HIV. Even though major population of migrants are in Construction and industrial sector a good number of migrants are working in hotels – restaurants industry, petty business, textiles, fishing and as daily wages workers.

The migrants in construction and industrial sectors live in clusters or large groups but other sector workers live in scattered areas. Most of the migrants in the project area are unskilled labourers.

Labour contractors and builders recruit migrants from their villages. They opt to come to Kerala as the wage system is higher than their states and opportunities are better here. Migrants, who come here after understanding the wide opportunity, bring their relatives or friends or recruit people from their nearby villages. Through interpersonal communication and counselling, we have found that migrants are the major clients of the sex workers in the project area, 27% of migrants in the project area go back to their native place frequently (2-3 times in a year). 70% visit their native place in every six months. Only 1% stays back in the destination for more than one year. Another 2% settle here with their family for more


than one year. And it was also observed that 91% of migrants have the habit of frequently changing their work place according to the wage they receive.

The target population of the project is 10,000 high risk migrants belonging to Kochi Corporation and neighboring Panchayaths and Municipalities of Ernakulam District. The project covers 5 sites (target areas) and 105 congregation points which assembles in Cochin Corporation, Trikkakara, Aluva, Kalamassery, Paravoor and Eloor Municipalities and in addition with Paravur, Alangad, Vazhakulam, Vypin, Edappally, Parakkadavu and Palluruthy Block Panchayats. The site-wise population distribution of our Project area includes Cochin Corporation (above 65,000), Kakkanad (above 30,000), Aluva (above 25,000), Kalamassery (above 20,000), and Paravoor (above ,000). 50

Medicine Collection

The project was developed in association with IMA to get general medicines and STI medicines for an effective and easy treatment of our key population.

IPC Sessions

General migrants were identified by the peer leaders and outreach workers from their concerned sites and IPC sessions were conducted among them to tackle high risk migrants. Individual and group sessions were given by the team and providing an awareness about HIV/AIDS, STIs, risk behavior, condom, treatment behavior and other program. The Interpersonal communication is mainly focused on behavior modification of the migrants. During this reporting period, 3094 sessions were conducted among 31711 general migrants.

- Staff of Suraksha Migrant Project, Kalamassery had conducted IPC Sessions at Lulu Corporate Office, Edappally on 11.08.2020 and for the migrants working for Prestige Smart City on 21.08.2020. Totally **500 migrants** had participated in the IPC Sessions.
- IPC sessions were also conducted for the migrants working in Yeskay, Kadavanthara on 09.10.2020. Ten sessions were taken in which 100 migrants had participated.

Health Camps

The Health camp schedule is developed on the basis of discussions conducted at various levels. However, convenience of the primary stakeholders has given priority and designing the schedule for clinic. The project has developed multi linguistic doctors to improve the quality of communication with the target audience. TI proposes to conduct 10 medical camps of 6 hour per in a month. During the last year 93 Health camps were conducted for the HRGs under the project area.

STI Care

60% of the registered migrants will be covered through health camps. In addition to the outreach clinics, facilities like Pulari clinics will be utilized for the screening and STI treatment of HR migrants. Persons with STI symptoms will be identified through risk assessment process by the Counselor. Special sessions will be given to HRMs on STIs to identify their problem and encourage them to seek treatment assistance. The identified STI cases will be treated at outreach clinics if possible or referred to nearby Pulari centers for treatment. TI focuses to ensure the CBHS testing of identified STI cases during the reporting period. TI focuses to ensure the VDRL testing as far as possible of identified STI cases during the reporting period. Comprehensive health camps with District Labour Department and PHC would be helpful to reach out in the screening of high risk migrants. Last year 195 STI cases were identified and treatment was given along with STI counseling.

Suraksha Health Camp / STI testing

Suraksha Migrant Team at Kalamassery had conducted Health Camp at IEC Drum Company, Kalamassery on 22.10.2020. During the health camp CBS test was conducted and 35 migrants were tested to check their HIV Status and 63 migrants were screened for STI. Health Camp was also conducted at SFS Kakkanad on 25.10.2020 and 54 migrants attended the medical camp.

CBHS (Community Based HIV Screening)

The project has developed site wise program management committee including site supervisors, managers Contractors and peer leaders. According to the convenience of migrants, they are screened for HIV **working days and non-working days with the support of CBS.**

There are a total of six ICTCs in the target area. The project has established effective linkages with all these ICTCs by conducting regular interaction with the staff members. In the previous year 3745 CBHS rapid tests were done and 5 migrants were found positive and hence all of them were linked to ART (Anti Retroviral Therapy) centre.

Blood Test (CBS Test)

CBS Test was carried out at Sreenivas Flour Mill, Edayar during Health Camp on 26.08.2020. Thirty five migrants were tested to check their HIV Status.


TB Screening

TB Screening is mainly conducted in Health Camps. At the time of counselling, the Counsellor enquires about the symptoms of TB like Cough, fever, weight loss and night sweat and so on. If anyone reported with these symptoms will be referred for confirmatory tests. Counsellor or ORWs will also do follow-ups with the diagnosed migrants.


Counseling










