

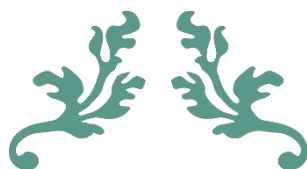

## 1. SOCIAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT STUDIES

Rajagiri outREACH has been empanelled as a Social Impact Assessment Study Unit for conducting SIA studies as per The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act 2013. Rajagiri outREACH is empanelled by Kerala State Revenue (B) Department to conduct Social Impact Studies at State Level and is also empanelled by the District Administration of Pathanamthitta, Kottayam, Idukki, Alappuzha, Ernakulam, Thrissur and Palakkad District to conduct District Level SIA Studies as per Sub-Section (I) of Section 4 of the RFCTLAR&R Act 2013. The SIA Study includes the Survey of the affected persons, Public-Hearing meetings and eventually to submit the report to the concerned District Collectors, Requiring Bodies and other officials after incorporating the comments received from the affected families and the authorities.

**Rajagiri outREACH is Empanelled as a State Level Social Impact Assessment Study Unit by Revenue (B) Department, Govt. of Kerala & 7 Districts.  
8 Studies were Conducted**

Since November 2016, **Seventy Nine Social Impact Assessment Studies** have been entrusted by Revenue (B) Department, Government of Kerala and Fourteen District Administration, to Rajagiri outREACH. During this reporting period, **11 SIA Studies were sanctioned** out of which **6 State Level Studies** were sanctioned. **9 SIA Studies** have been completed and the Final Reports have been submitted before the Revenue (B) Department, Government of Kerala and concerned District Administration. **8 Public Hearings** were held in various districts during this period. 125 SIA Proposals for New Bids were submitted. A brief summary of different SIA studies conducted in the reporting year of 2021-2022, is furnished below

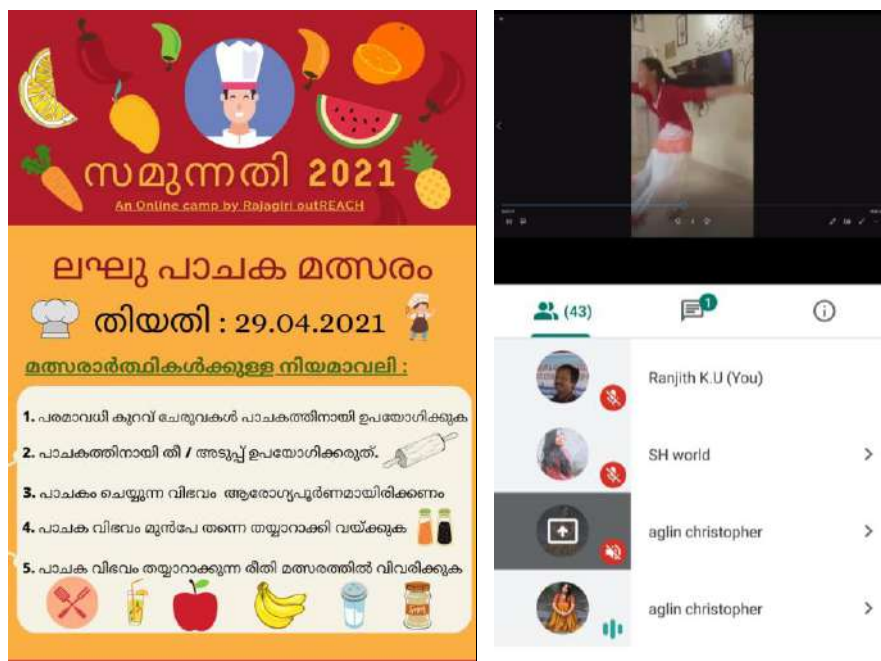

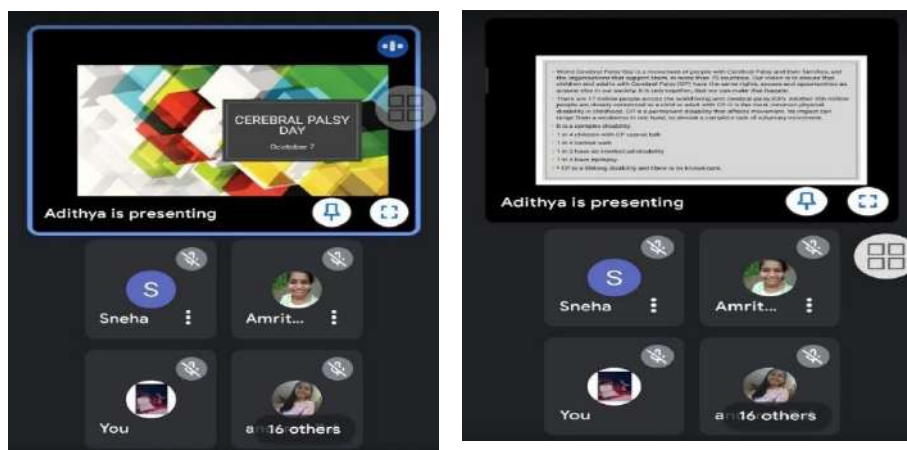
### **3. Online Sessions and House Visits conducted for the Sponsorship Children**

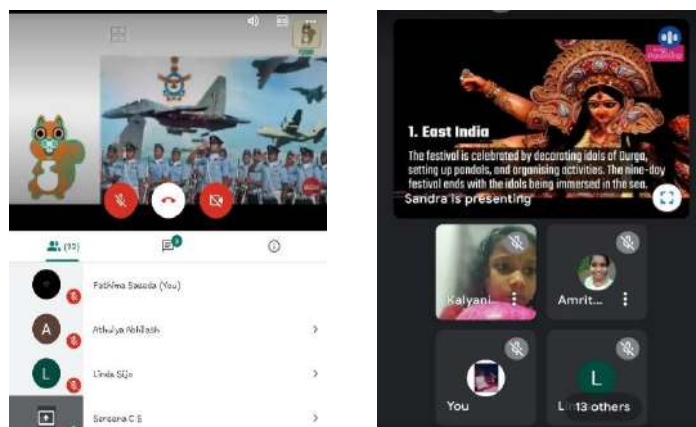

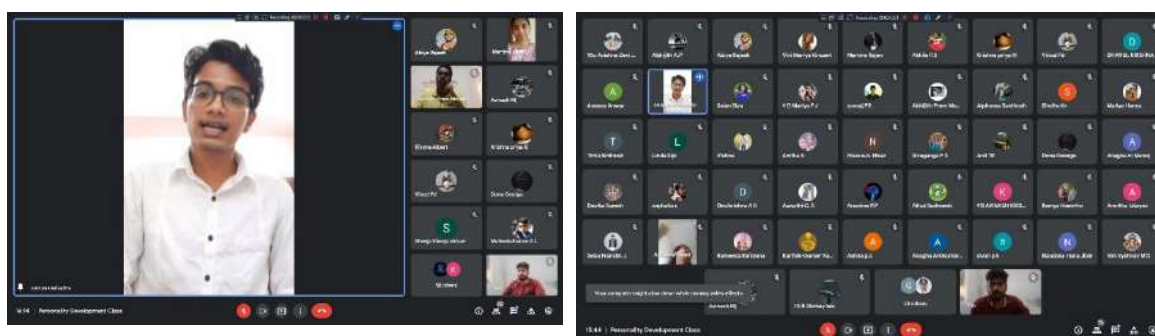

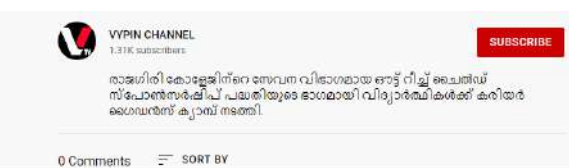

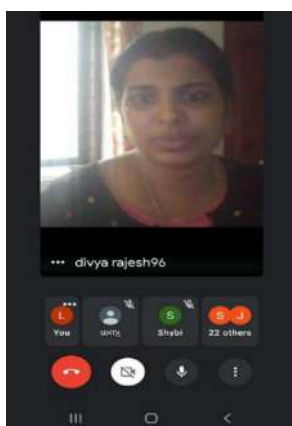

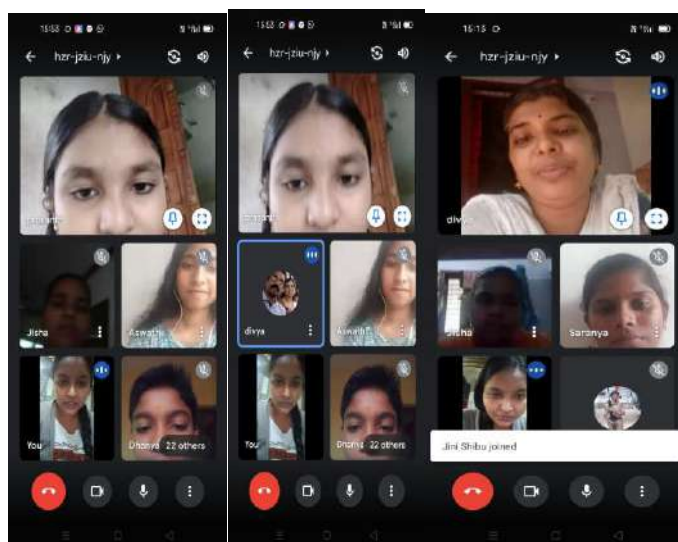

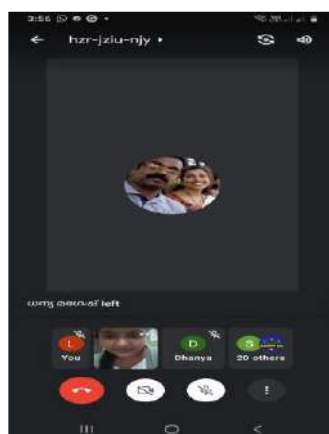

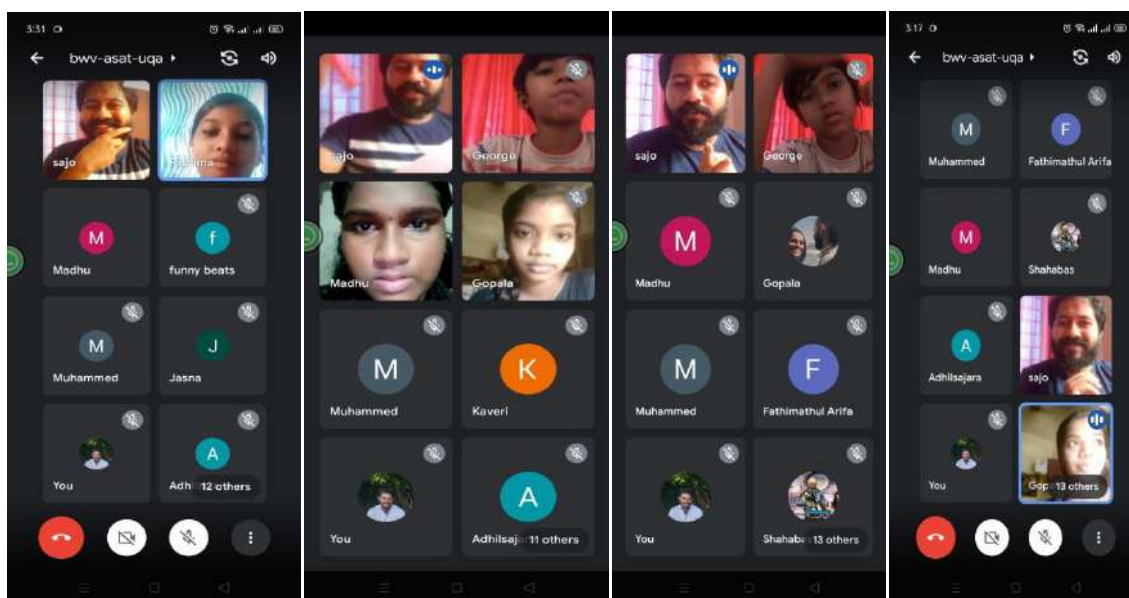

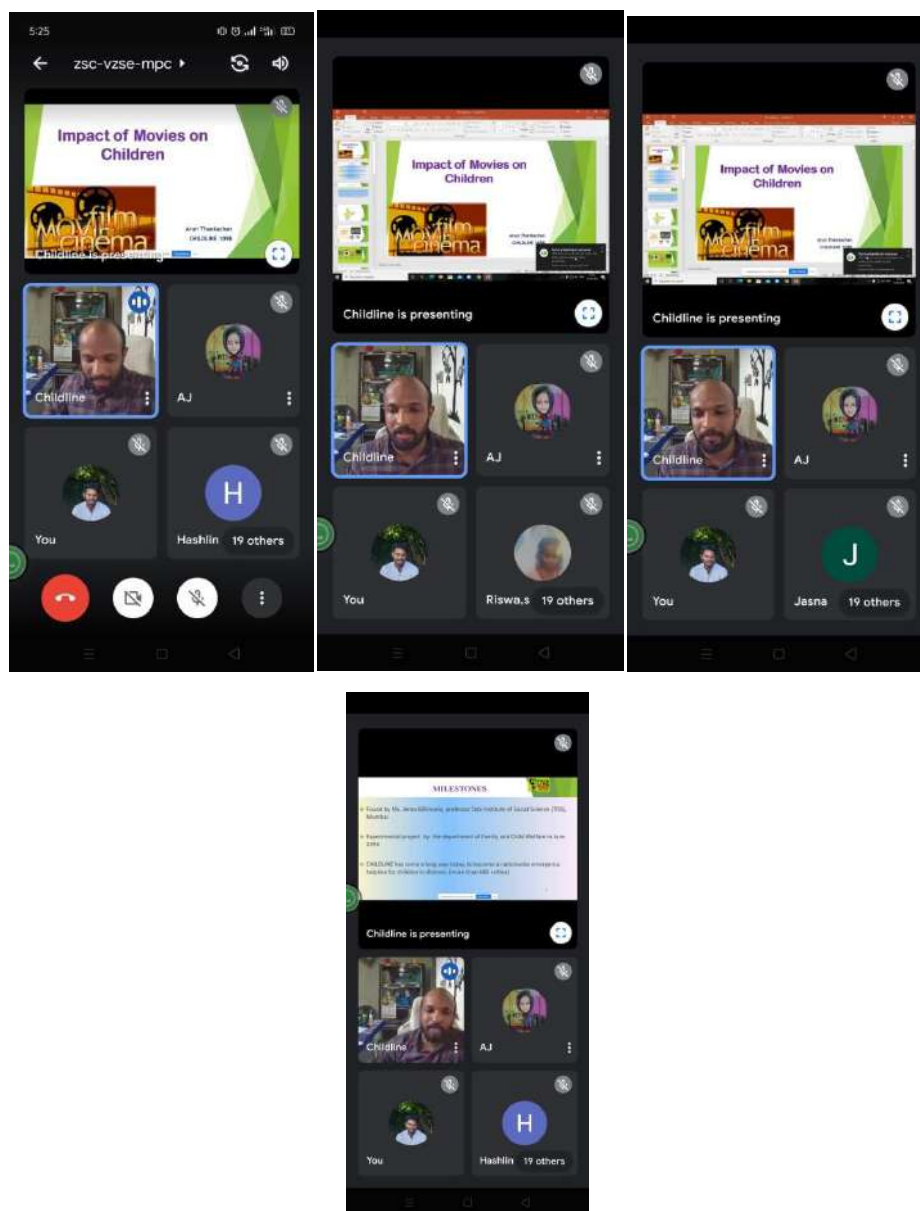

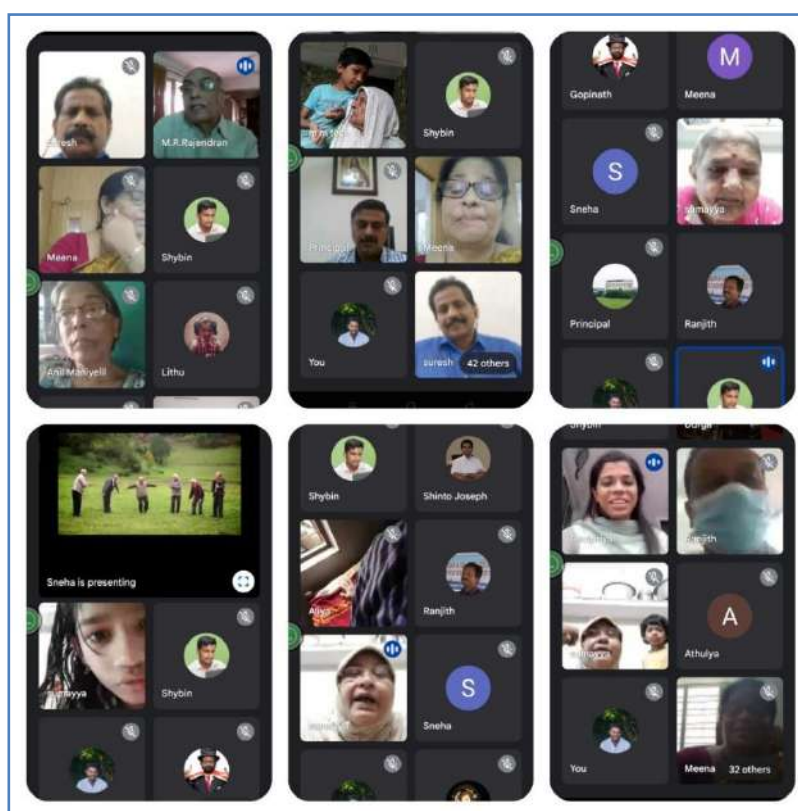

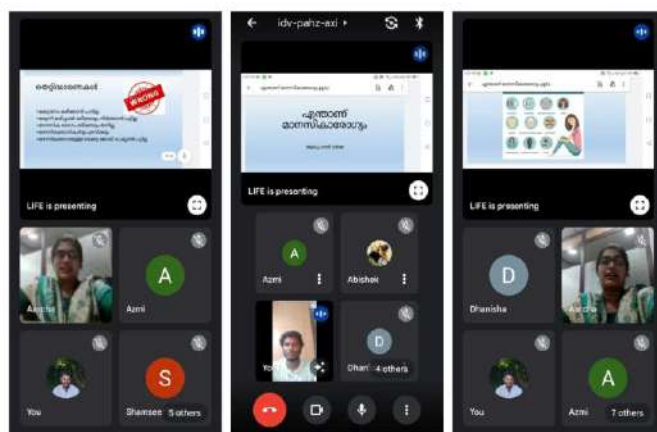

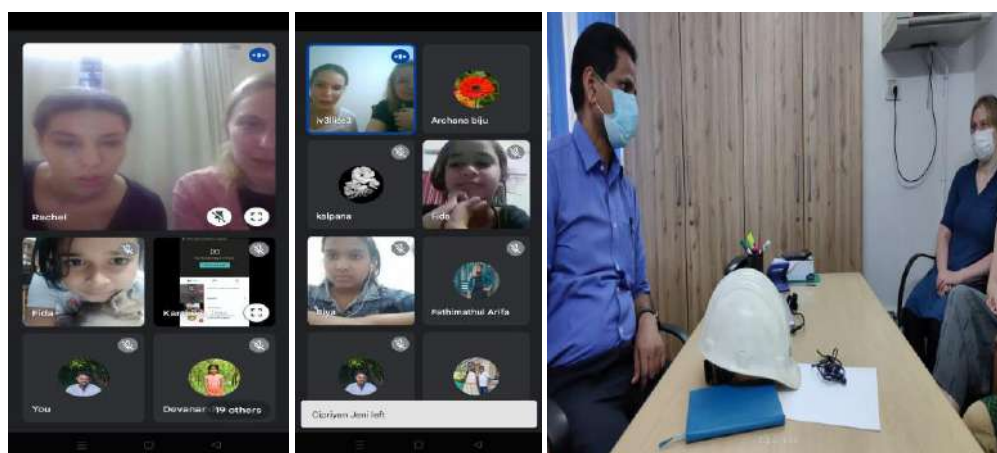

### **3. CSR Initiatives of Sud-Chemie (I) Pvt. Ltd. - Child Sponsorship Programme**

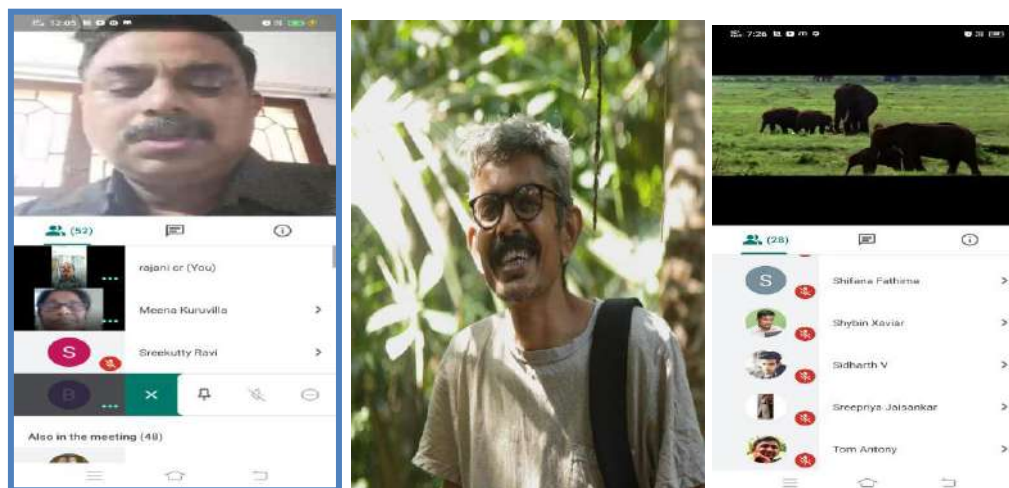

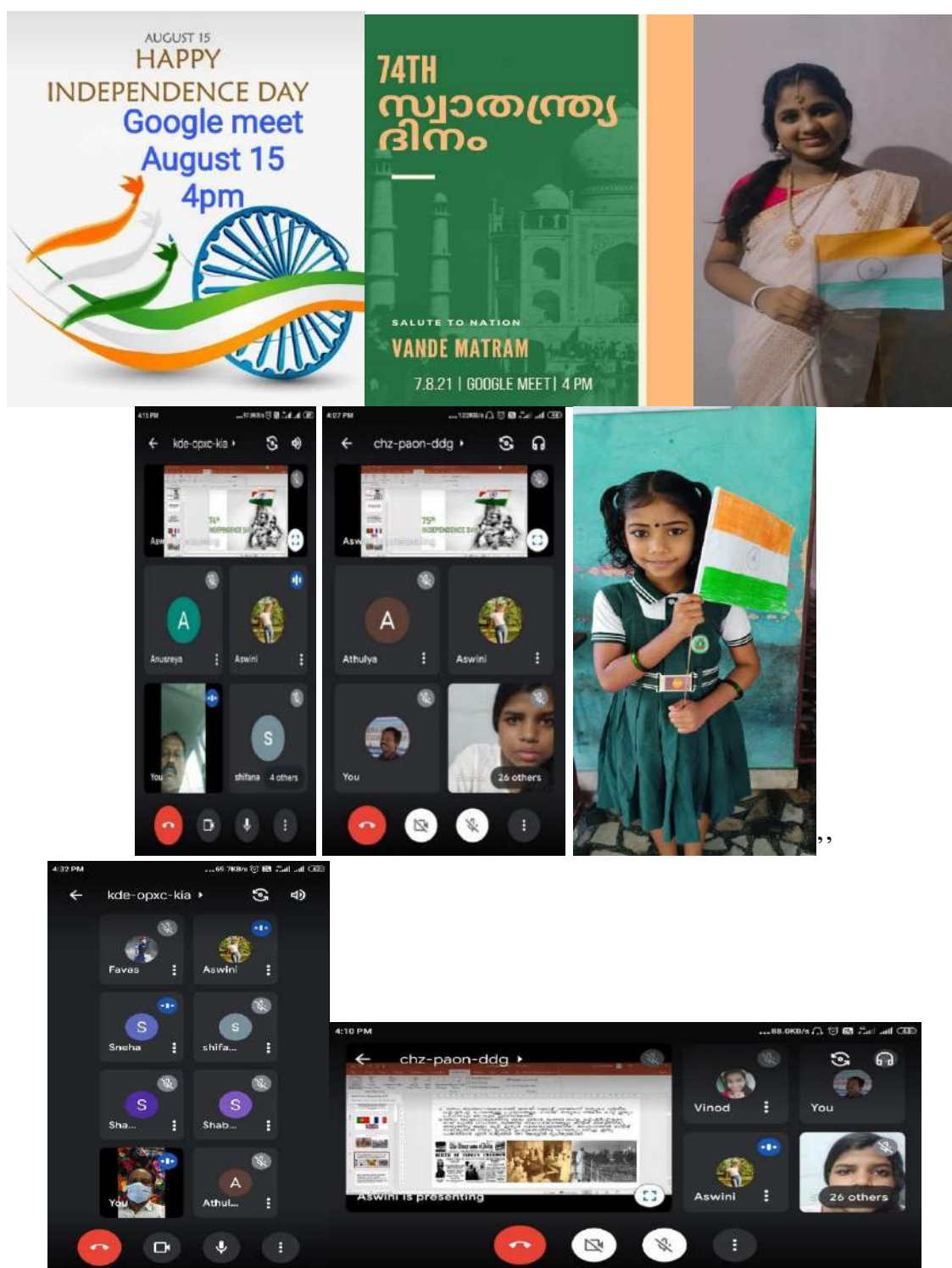

##### **i. Online Children's Meeting**

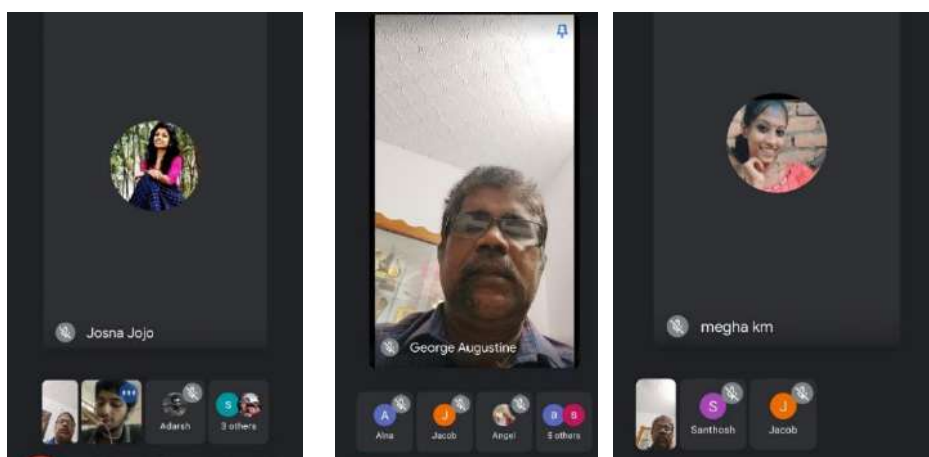
Children's meetings were conducted on Saturdays and public holidays with the aim to bring them to a common platform to eliminate the boredom of being confined to home during the COVID-19 pandemic period. 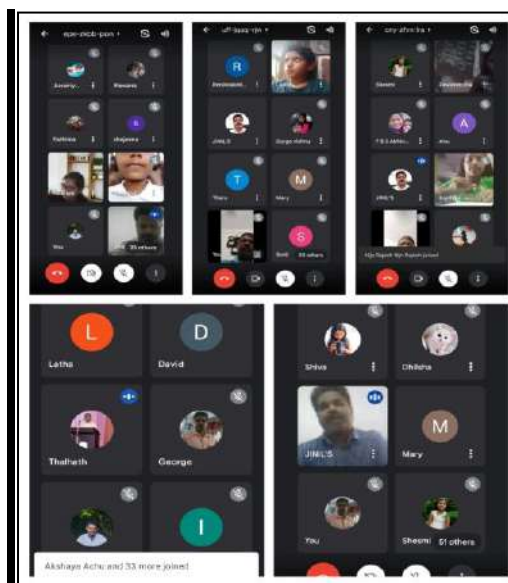

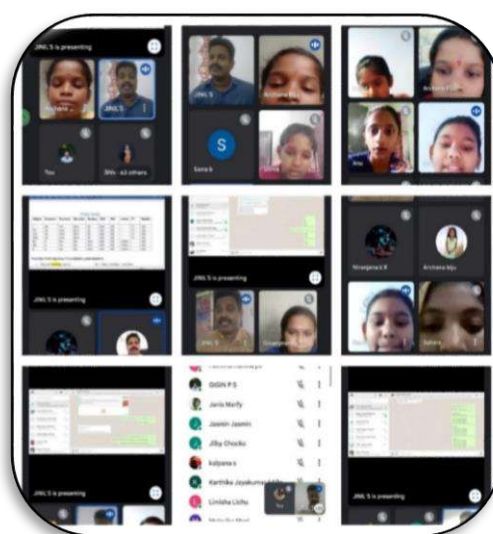
- Provided guidance to improve children's academic and co-curricular skills.

- **Hindi Speaking Classes**

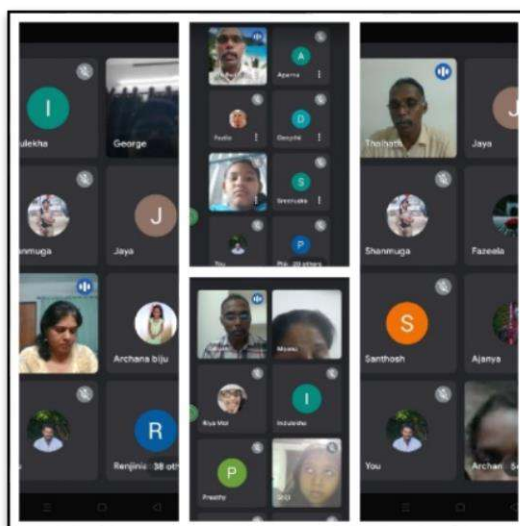

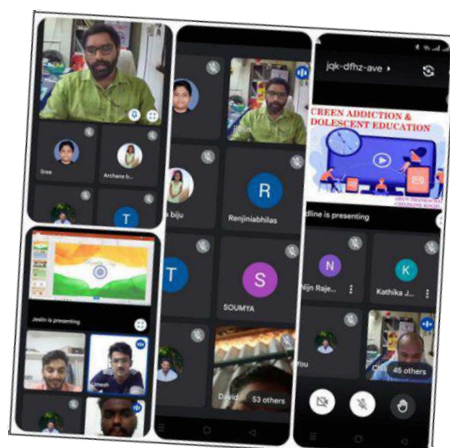

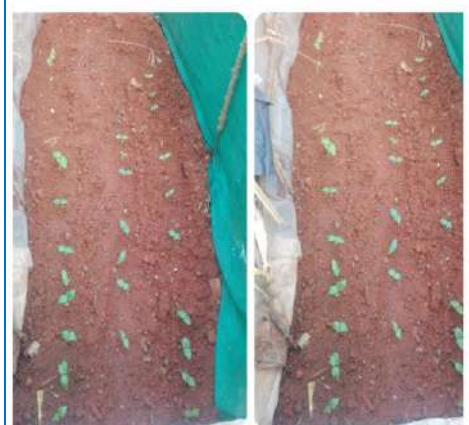

**Onam celebration held on 20th, 25th and 28th August 2021**

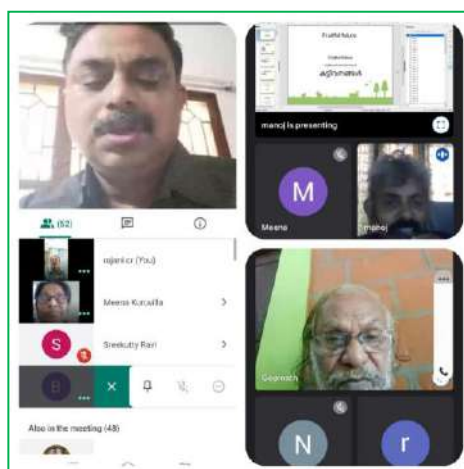
- **Christmas & New Year Celebration**

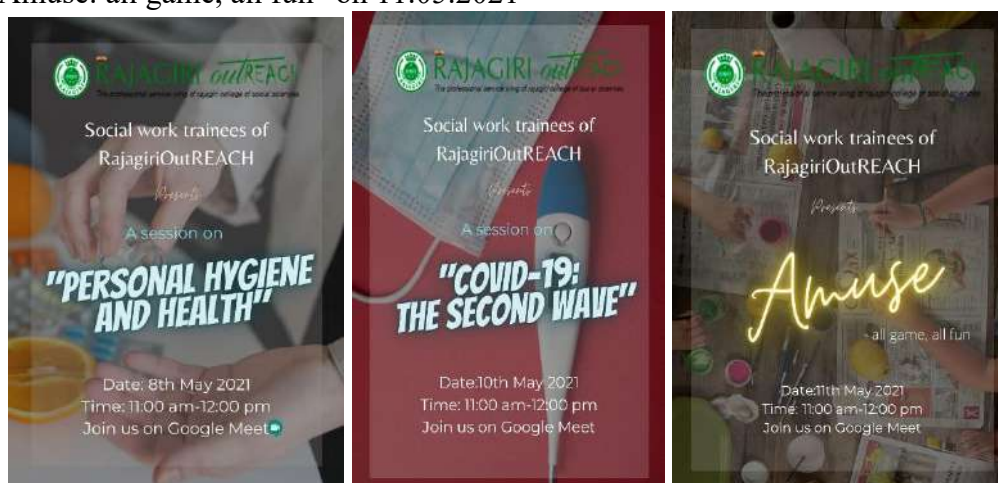

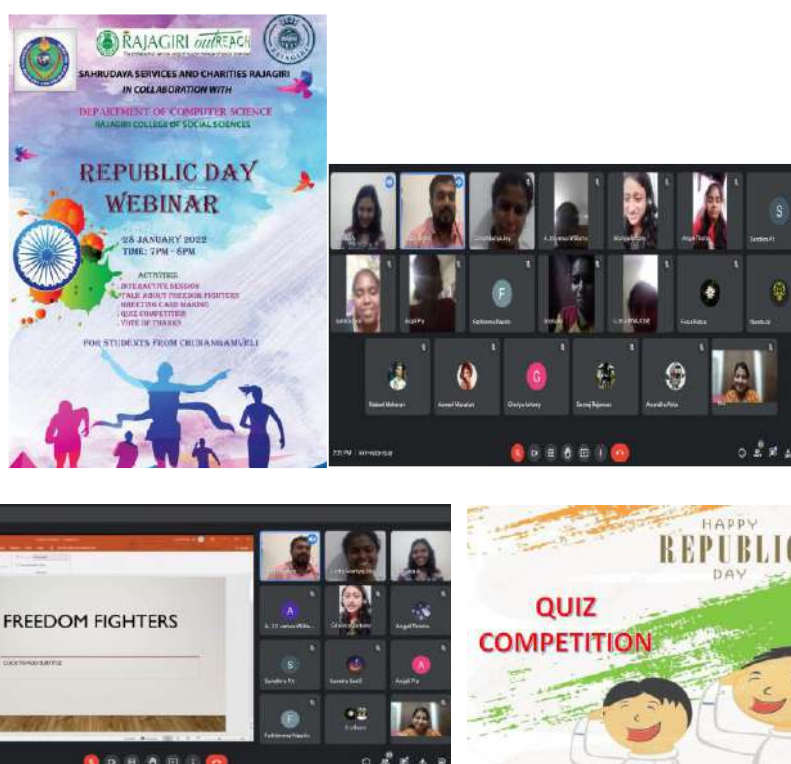

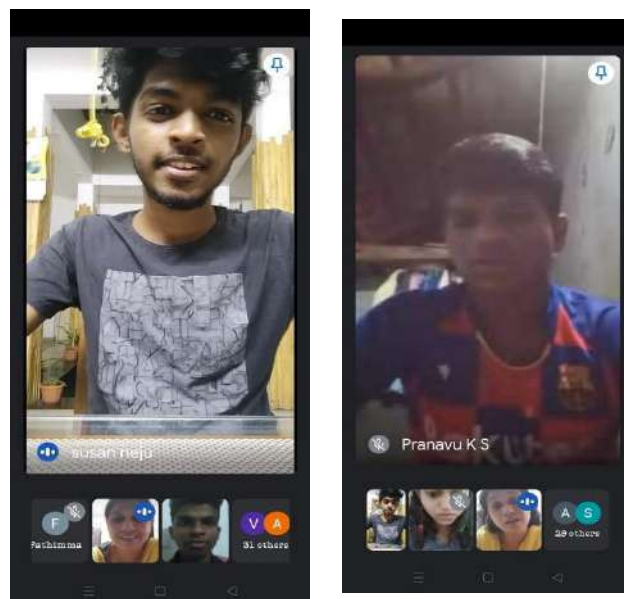

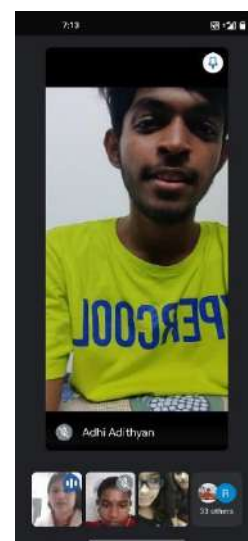

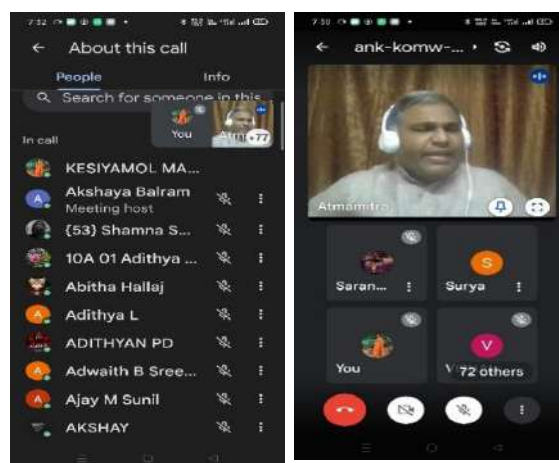

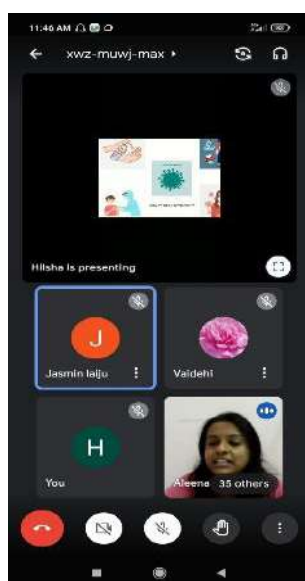


Online Spoken English Class conducted for Sponsorship Children on 11.09.2021

i. **Onam Celebration at Kunnathunad**

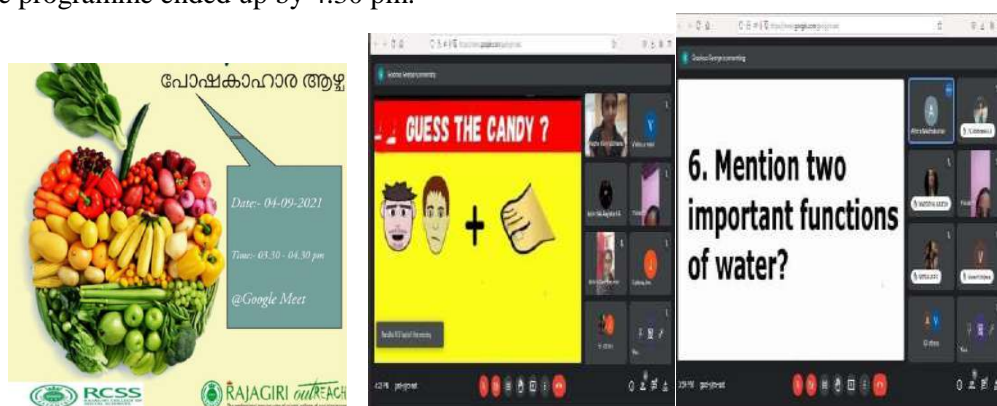

ii. **Nutrition Week Online Program for the Sponsorship Children – Kunnathunad (Kinder for Kinder) – 04.09.2021**

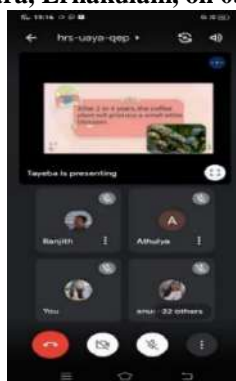

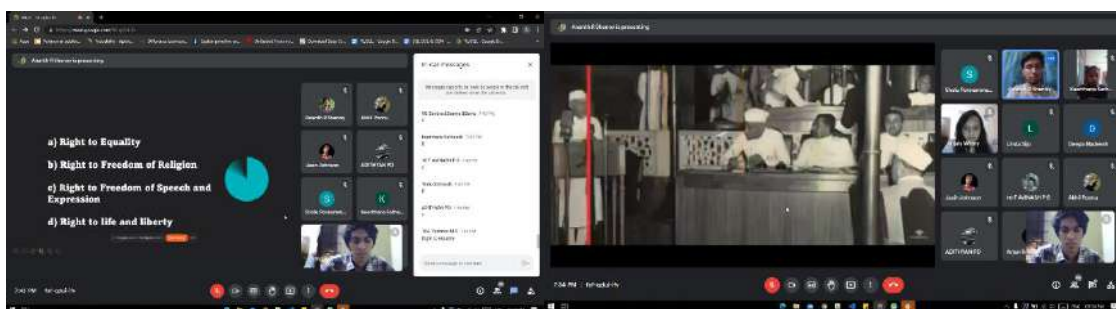

## 4.B. CRECHE PROGRAMME

During the COVID-19 pandemic period, the two Crèches implemented by Rajagiri outREACH catering to 50 children in each centre (below 3 years of age), which focuses mainly for working parents who live below the poverty line located at Kunjhattukara in Ernakulam District and Ezhupunna South in Alappuzha, could not function as per the Government restrictions. Hence from April 2021 to February 13, 2022, activities were not recorded. The Project is jointly supported by State Social Welfare Board and the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Kerala.

On February 14, 2022, the two Crèches at Kunjhattukara in Ernakulam District and Ezhupunna South in Alappuzha, consisting of 50 children in each centre, were reopened and commenced its functioning as per the Government sanction. Under the National Crèche Scheme, the grant of 60% from State government, 30% of National level and 10% of NGO.

### 1. Visit to Kunjhattukara Crèche

The Kunjhattukara Crèche is situated in Ernakulam district under the division of Vazhakulam CDPO. There are 15 kids in Kunjhattukara crèche. Mrs. Lissy Mathai, Teacher and Mrs. Jayakumari, helper are employed in the crèche. Mrs. Linda Chacko had visited the crèche on 3rd March 2022.

#### **4.C. KAVAL PROJECT – PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN IN CONFLICT WITH LAW**

*Supported by,*

*Department of Women and Child Development Govt. of Kerala & District Child Protection Unit Ernakulam*

Kaval is the project initiated by Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Kerala for the betterment of the children in conflict with law. The project was launched in 2017, in Trivandrum, Kozhikode and Palakkad districts, and it has now been expanded to all the 14 districts in Kerala. Kaval is being implemented by the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) of Women and Child Department, Government of Kerala, Thiruvananthapuram, in association with the National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS) Bangalore.

Rajagiri outREACH has been empanelled as an NGO as per the Order No. ICPS 3/9665/17 (1) dated 05/10/2017 issued by Director, Social Justice Department to implement the Kaval Project in Ernakulam District. Kaval Project of Rajagiri outREACH is working under the supervision of District Child Protection Unit and the other supporting authorities are Juvenile Justice Board, CWC, Police, Excise and Observation Homes. Kaval Project of Ernakulam District was launched officially on February 03, 2018 at Government Observation Home, Kakkanad. During the period 2021-2022, Juvenile Justice Board had assigned **67** Children who were in conflict with law to the Kaval Project of Rajagiri outREACH.

Rajagiri outREACH has also been empanelled by Department of Women and Child Development, Govt. of Kerala as per the Order No. ICPS 3/684/20 dated 14.09.2020 to implement the Kaval Project in Thrissur District.

##### **1. Aim**

- Provide psychosocial care for children in conflict with law.
- Create a better and conducive environment for children in conflict with law.
- Prevent the circumstances in which the child may be forced to commit an offence.

##### **2. Objectives:**

- To understand the psychosocial problems among children in conflict with law
- To develop an intervention module for working with Children in conflict with law by the services provider.
- To train various stakeholders and institutionalize psychosocial care in existing services for Children in conflict with law.
- To incorporate psychosocial care in the existing services for Children in conflict with law in all districts of Kerala in the subsequent phase.

### 3. Implementation of the program

The program is carried out with legal permission from the Juvenile Justice Board in the district through the administrative role played by District Child Protection Officer. The selected NGOs in the district shall implement the programme with the supervision and guidance of JJB and DCPO. The intervention for each child takes place in three levels as individual, family and at school. The psychosocial problems of each child are studied and an individual care plan is developed for each child with support from parents and other important stakeholders which focuses on the holistic care for children.

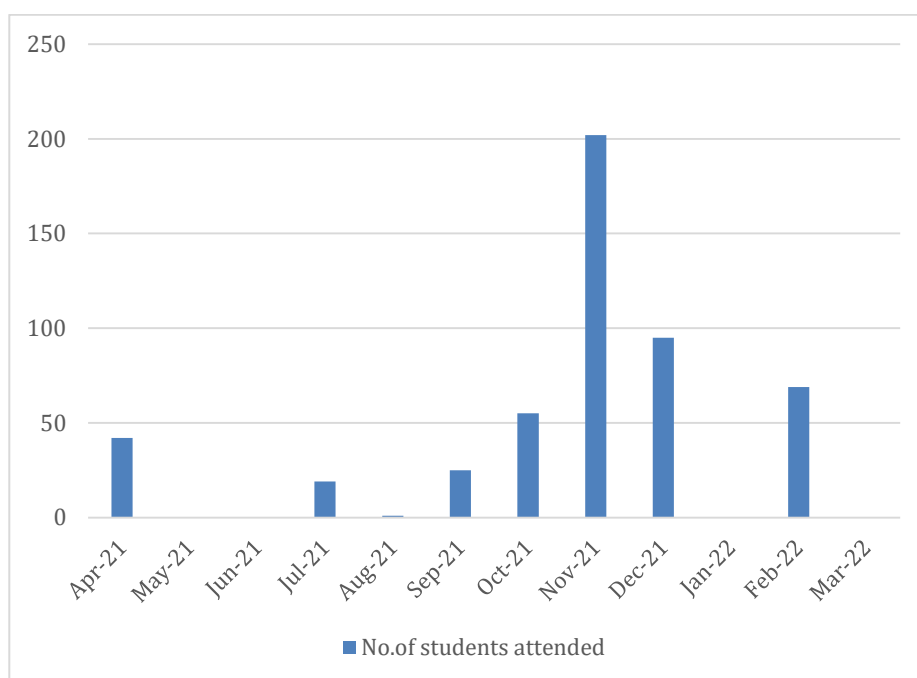

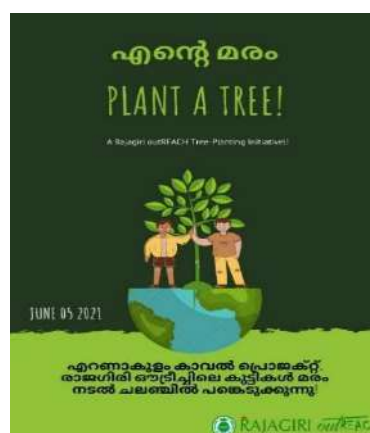

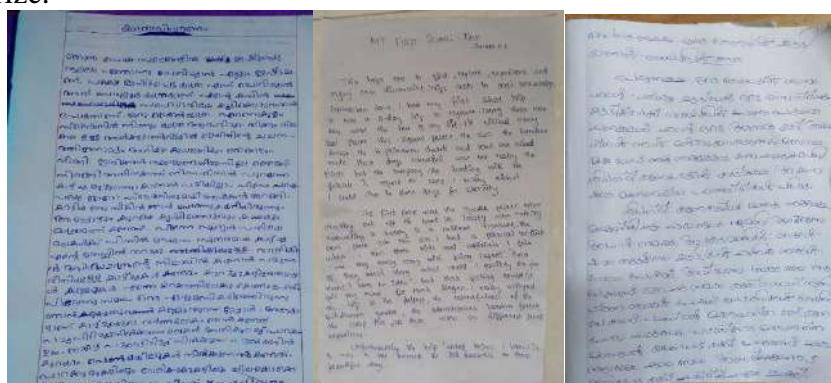
## xvi. District Resource Centre Induction Training

**Participants:-** Staff of Rajagiri outREACH Kaval and Kaval Plus programmes at Ernakulam and Thrissur Districts and staff of CHILDLINE - Support organization ,Malappuram District (Projects implemented by Rajagiri outREACH ) and CHILDLINE kochi- Nodal organization, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences.

The programme was presided by Fr. Shinto Joseph, Assistant Director of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences. In his presidential address, he had elaborated about the wide area of opportunities in conducting researches in relation to rights and protection of children in the society and also community based interventions focusing on scientific evidence and facts that would reinforce child protection policies and mechanisms existing in the society.

The training sessions were handled by Mrs. Meena Kuruvilla, Director of Rajagiri outREACH on Child related Laws in India and POCSO Act 2012. During the first session, she had provided information on UNCRC and its articles in brief along with child related laws strongly enforced in the country like prohibition of Child Marriage Act 2006, Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act 1986 and amendment in the year of 2016 etc. In the second session, she had addressed about the importance of POCSO Act enacted in the country which protect and prevent children in both gender from all kinds of sexual offences in the society. Different types of offenses and its legal procedures were elaborated with particular examples which propagated more information and ideas for child protection functionaries to practice in the field with strong legal and theoretical ground and also discussed on the procedure how to handle the child sexual abuse cases and provide psycho social intervention services and rehabilitation of the child in the community. Each section of the Act were discussed in detail during the session which gave more understanding for the participants, which in turn was very useful and effective to apply in the field. The participants were able to clarify their overall queries regarding the topic.

The training programme was concluded by Dr. Fr. Saju MD, Vice Principal and Associate Director of Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), with the suggestion of improving the quality services in application of theory into practice towards the upliftment of the vulnerable sections of the society and also to develop concrete strategies and methods for the same. The half day session concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by Mr. Jithin Xavier, Program Coordinator, Kaval Project at Ernakulam.

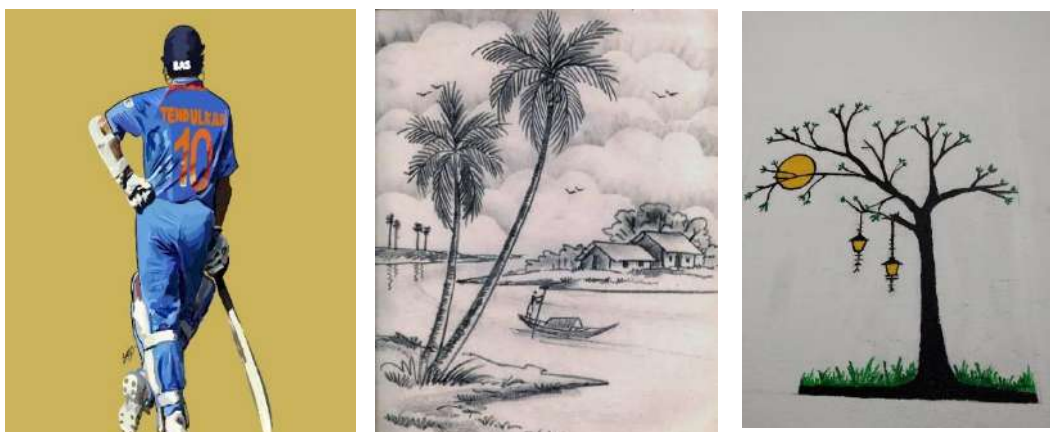

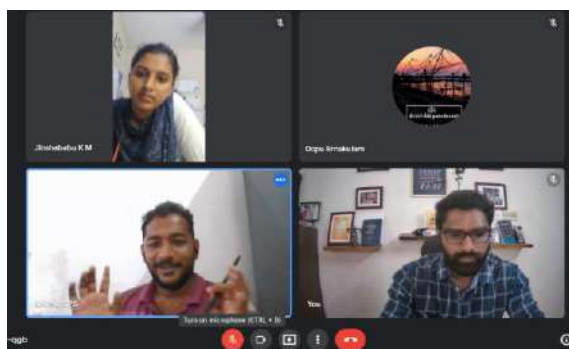


Kaval Monthly Review Meeting at Observation Home, Ernakulam on 03.02.2022

### Conclusion:

KAVAL Programme is an innovative program initiated by Kerala State under the Department of Women and Child Development for providing psycho-social support to children in Conflict with Law for their social reintegration and rehabilitation. There were 87 children included in the project in the first quarter of the financial year 2021-22. Presently there are 67 children benefiting from the Kaval Programme. Kaval Rajagiri outREACH had been providing continuous psycho-social support to children and their families which helped to reduce the recidivism of offences among children. Kaval team could develop good relationship and cooperation with majority of children and their families for which Life Skills education, Parent Management Training, Group Work were effectively conducted and also regularly phone follow up and Home visits were conducted in order to bring about changes in them and their family too. Networking and advocacy with various government departments and NGOs within and outside the district could benefit for effective functioning of Kaval activities in the district and also initiated many community level programmes for children which really supported each and every children for their well-being.

#### v. Psychosocial Interventions

Each child who had come into conflict with law undergoes a systematic and step by step process of intervention that involves organizing, coordinating the formal and informal activities, and services, to ensure optimum level of services to the child. Towards providing intensive and comprehensive care a multidisciplinary intersectoral approach to support the child in the community by involving varied professionals covering range of service such as legal and law enforcement, crisis intervention, health (mental and physical), de-addiction, economic support, education support, family support, vocational and skill training & employment, institutional services and social welfare support is developed. The multidisciplinary team will be led by the Juvenile Justice Board. Other sectors involved in psychosocial care for children in conflict with law are District Child Protection Unit, Police, Education, Health (Physical health and mental health), Local Self-government bodies and Non-Government Organisations. The

interdisciplinary team consisted of legal officers, police, social workers, psychiatrist, psychologist, other health professionals, administrators, teachers, vocational and skills trainers.

The KAVAL team conducted psychosocial interventions during the period 2021-2022 such as Individual session, Family session, Group work sessions and also provided educational support to the needy children. In the individual session the team provided individual counselling for about 51 children. Group work was also conducted for 37 children, by using the psychosocial medium such as Family portrait and Writing, clay modelling, facial expression. Kaval team provided family counselling session to the children's family.

#### **vi. Life Skill Education**

Life-Skill Education as defined by the UNICEF "a behavior change or behavior development approach to address a balance of three areas; knowledge, attitude and skills"

The skills that make an individual adjust and adapt to the changes and challenges brought to them on an everyday basis are known as life skills. Some examples of life skills are effective communication, decision making, critical thinking, problem-solving, making connections, etc. These are an essential set of skills that is learned by a kid throughout their life to enhance their lifestyle in a better way possible. Learning a life skill is a very important and mandatory part of growing up.

In everyday life, the development of life skills helps to:-

- Find new ways of thinking and problem solving.
- Recognize the impact of their actions and teaches them to take responsibility for what they do rather than blame others.
- Build confidence both in spoken skills and for group collaboration and cooperation.
- Develop a greater sense of self-awareness and appreciation for others.

The KAVAL team conducted life skill education sessions during the period of 2021-2022. A total of 49 children had actively participated and cooperated during the sessions. The children had no idea about what is life skill and the importance of life skill in everyday life. Through these sessions, the team was able to educate them about the importance of life skill in everyday life.

Mainly discussed topics in the session were:

- Self-awareness
  - Empathy
  - Problem solving
  - Decision making
  - Interpersonal relationship
  - Communication
  - Creative thinking
  - Critical thinking
  - Coping with emotions
  - Coping with stress
1. On 11th August 2021 a session on the “**Decision Making and Problem Solving**” was given to the children with the help of activities. The session began with the introductory speech by Ms. Anjana Internship Trainee. She spoke about the importance of self-awareness. The session content was handled by Ms. Athira K.P., Project Coordinator and Mr. Jaison Varghese, Case Worker. The session was mainly focused on the Problem solving and decision making in life. It included content areas like communication skills which were listening, empathy, self-disclosure, decision making, problem-solving, and conflict resolution, relating to others with respect and responsibility. The session was more of an interactive session. The active participation of the children was ensured throughout the session. The valid points during the session were made by Ms. Athira and Mr. Jaison. The session was concluded with the vote of thanks given by Ms. Anjana.
  2. On 30<sup>th</sup> October 2021 a session on **Problem solving and Decision making** was given to the children. The programme was conducted in Rajagiri outREACH Kaval Office, Thrissur. There were about 9 children, who had participated in the session. The programme had started with an introductory speech by Mr. Jaison Varghese, Case Worker, Kaval. 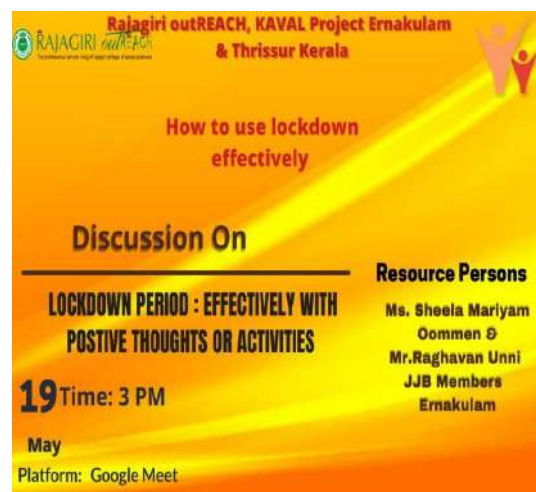

### 2. Personal Interaction

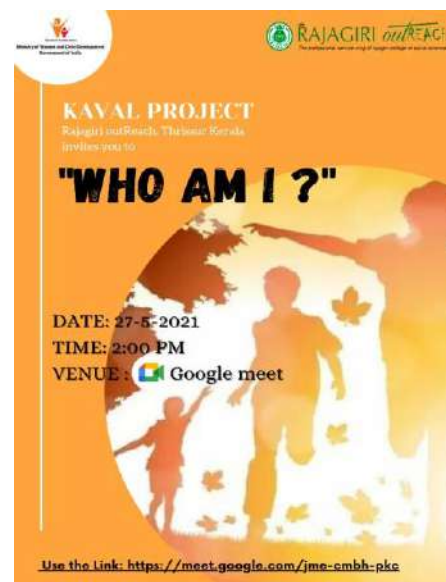

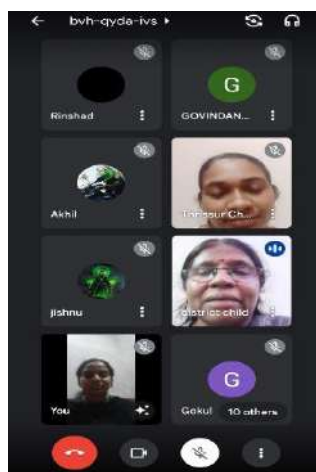

by Mr. Jaison Varghese, Case Worker. The children actively participated in the session as well as in the entertainment programmes by singing songs, etc.

3. On 26<sup>th</sup> November 2021, a group session was conducted for the children at Kaval, Thrissur. 5 children had participated. The medium used for the session was “**Thematic Story Card**”. The session was led by the Mr. Jaison Varghese, Case Worker. The children actively participated and narrated their situation based on happiness and their future.
4. On 14<sup>th</sup> December 2021 the Kaval team conducted group work for 6 children at Kaval, Thrissur Office. The introductory session related to group work was given by Ms. Athira K.P., Kaval Coordinator. The medium used for the group work session was facial expression. The children shared about their future by using the facial expression medium.
5. On 17<sup>th</sup> January 2022 the Kaval, Thrissur team, had conducted **Group Work for 6 children** at Kaval Thrissur office. The session was started by a small introduction related to group work which was given by Ms. Athira K.P., Kaval Coordinator. The children had actively participated in the session. The medium used for the group work session was writing. The children had written about their future plans by using this medium.
6. On 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2022, the Kaval team had conducted group session for 4 children. The medium that was provided for the group work was “**Clay Modelling**”. In this session, the team got a better understanding about the children.

#### **xii. Family Session**

On 8<sup>th</sup> February 2022 and 24<sup>th</sup> February 2022, the Kaval Team had conducted family sessions for the families of 4 children. During this session they interacted with the families regarding family relationship.

#### **xiii. Individual Session**

On 3<sup>rd</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2022, the Kaval Team had conducted individual session for 3 children. In this session, the children were motivated in their studies.

#### **4.E. KAVAL PLUS**

**Community Based Rehabilitation of Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse & Community Based Rehabilitation and Reintegration of Children in Need of Care and Protection**

**Rajagiri outREACH Kaval Plus programme's activities from 9<sup>th</sup> September 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022**

##### **INTRODUCTION**

Children are the valuable resources of a country. A conducive environment is needed for their holistic growth and development. In order to provide comprehensive support to Children in Need of Care and Protection (CNCP) and Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA), Kerala's Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Kerala, had implemented Kaval Plus project. This programme was launched because, 15 homes of Children in Kerala account for about 500 inmates and leave 96% of high-risk children in need of support and unprotected in the community.

It was launched in December 2020 in the Thiruvananthapuram and Palakkad districts and after the success of the project, the Government had decided to expand Kaval Plus to five more districts viz., Ernakulam, Idukki, Malappuram, Kozhikode and Kannur in 2021. In Ernakulam district, Rajagiri outREACH and Blue Point were selected for implementing the project among the children.

Nearly 96% of the high-risk children live in unsafe environments and living with alcoholic parents, or are school dropouts with mental health issues and unprotected in the community. The programme aims to identify those children and ensure long-term rehabilitation and better quality of life for them. . The project will be implemented with the support of the NGOs experienced in working with children. Two NGOs are selected in each district by a committee of District Child Protection Officer, CWC Representative and Protection Officer. In Ernakulam district, Kaval Plus project implementing NGOs are Rajagiri outREACH and Blue Point. The cases from rural areas are referred to Rajagiri outREACH. This classification is based on the basis of police station limit.

Community Based Rehabilitation of Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse and Community Based Rehabilitation and Reintegration of Children in Need of Care and Protection through Psycho-Social Approach – **Kaval Plus Project**, which is sanctioned by the Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Kerala and Supported by District Child Protection Unit, Ernakulam.

Rajagiri outREACH has been empanelled as an NGO as per the Order No. DCPU/E/1132/21 dated 27.07.2021, issued by the Office of the District Child Protection Officer, Ernakulam to implement the Kaval Plus Project in Ernakulam District. Kaval Plus Project of Rajagiri outREACH is working under the supervision of District Child Protection Unit and the other supporting authorities are CWC, Police, Excise and Children's home.

**The Official Launch of Rajagiri outREACH Kaval Plus commenced on September 09, 2021.**

### **Training Programme attended by the team members of Kaval Plus, Rajagiri outREACH**

## **6. In house Training program**

On 05.10.2021, in collaboration with Rajagiri Childline Kochi, Rajagiri outREACH, had conducted a training programme for Kaval Plus Staff Members and for the staff who were working in the field of child protection under Rajagiri outREACH. The session was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Shinto Joseph CMI, Assistant Director, RCSS and Live Lab Coordinator, Rajagiri outREACH. During the training session, Rev. Fr. Saju M.D., Associate Director and Vice Principal, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), Kalamassery, spoke about the scope of Research in the field of Child Protection and had also conveyed his message about the importance of documentation. The training session was taken by Ms. Meena Kuruvilla, Project Director, Rajagiri outREACH. She spoke about the various acts which are associated with child protection. The participants got a clear idea about POCSO Act, JJB, JJ Act, etc. The session concluded by 1 p.m.

### **Nature of the project activities.**

The process of the Kaval Plus project runs like this; the reported cases of Children in Need of Care and Protection and the Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse before the Child Welfare Committee will be referred to DCPU to include them in Kaval plus Project. As per the order from Child Welfare Committee, DCPU will transfer the cases to Kaval plus, Rajagiri outREACH. The project coordinator and caseworkers conduct home visits to each child's home. Based on the assessment carried out using standardized tools, multiple needs of children will be identified. As per the need



assessment and observations over the children, the members starts the required interventions to support them.

From 09/09/2021 to 31/03/2022 the team members of Kaval plus Rajagiri were allotted to assess 28 CSA (Child Sexual Abuse) cases and 13 CNCP cases (Children in Need of Care and Protection).

**Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA)**

Survivors of child sexual abuse are one of the most important groups of children in difficult circumstances. There is a need to support these children through community based supportive programs to reduce re-victimisation as well as ensuring their mainstreaming to build up potentials and lead a purposeful life without the baggage of violence against them.

## **Socio – Economic status of the survivors of child sexual abuse (CSA)**

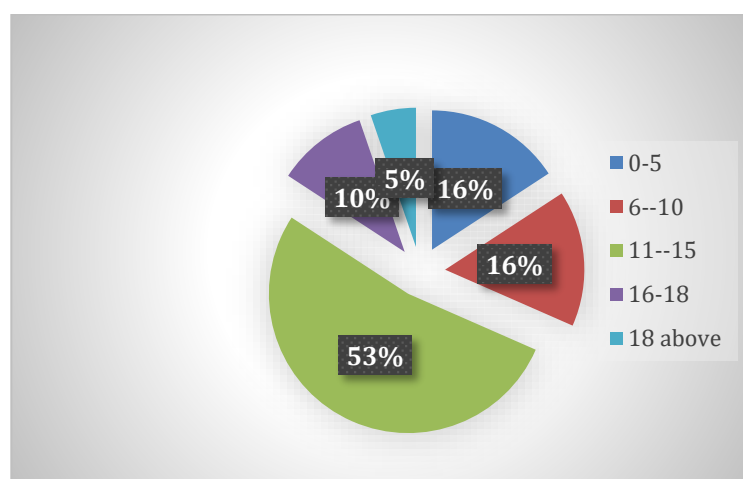
An assessment was conducted among 19 survivors of child sexual abuse of age group 4 to 18 years. Data based analysis of the Survivors of child sexual abuse is given below.

### **i. Gender based data regarding the Survivors of Child Sexual abuse (CSA):**

Findings show that the majority of survivors of child sexual abuse are girl children. Boys those who are the survivors of child sexual abuse are consider as CNCP (Children in Need of Care and Protection) in Kaval Plus.. Under CSA category, there are 19 girls are sexually abused.

### **ii. Age composition of Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA)**

The age distribution shows that, the majority of survivors (53%) are comes under the age of 11 to 15 years (10 Children) and in between the age group of 0-5, there are three survivors (16%). There are two children as the survivors under the age group of 16-18 (10%) and under the age group of 6-10 there are three survivors (16%) and there is one child as above 18 years.

### **Nature of problems faced by survivors of child sexual abuse**

The survivors of child sexual abuse (CSA) are going through multiple problems. Following are types of problems faced by survivors of child sexual abuse

Children in relationships are seen to have higher chances of being abused. According to the findings, 9 out of 19 children reported being in a relationship (love affair). Children from dysfunctional families, and families facing lack of safety are facing lots of physical – psychological issues. Two of the children reported that the abuser is within the family. Other problems observed among children were alcoholic fathers (6), poverty (9) social isolation (1). Three of them are unwed mothers and it's also a severe problem that may affect the safety of children.

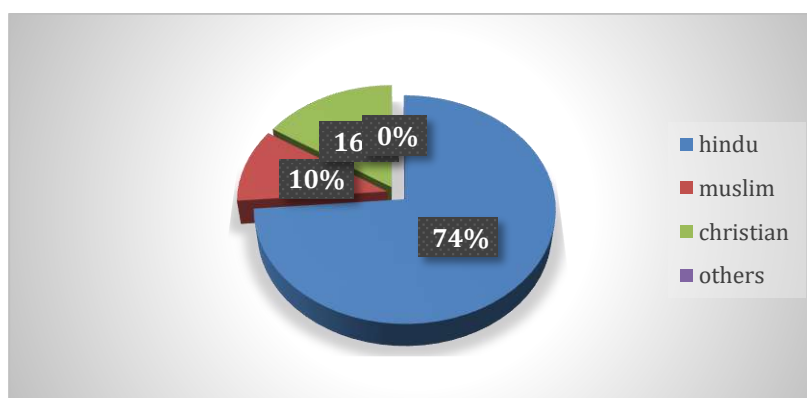


### **Details of dropouts among the survivors of child sexual abuse**

Among the survivors of child sexual abuse, four out of nineteen children are dropouts .Three of them were dropped out from 9<sup>th</sup> standard and one is dropped out from 12<sup>th</sup> standard. Three children among dropouts are unwed mothers.

To ensure interdisciplinary -multispectral services for the survivors of child sexual abuse(CSA), the Kaval Plus , Rajagiri outREACH seeks support from other stakeholders such as Child Welfare Committee (CWC), District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Educational institutions, Police Station, Integrated Child Development office, Panchayath/municipality office, Department of Scheduled Caste, Health centre, District Women Protection Office etc.

### **Children in Need of Care and Protection (CNCP)**

Most of the children in need of care and protection do not have adult support to help them in such difficulties, and this will aggravate their problem. Many of these children experience physical -sexual abuse, and discrimination, termination from education, labelling and isolation. It is essential to ensure the safety and security for these children to prevent the occurrence of future untrodden events.

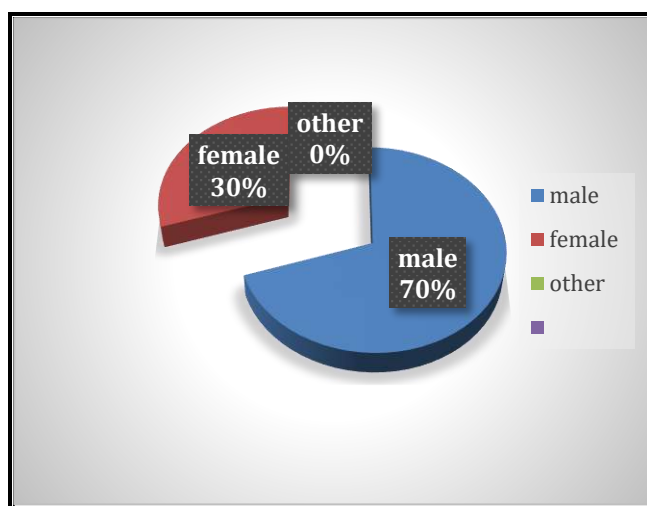

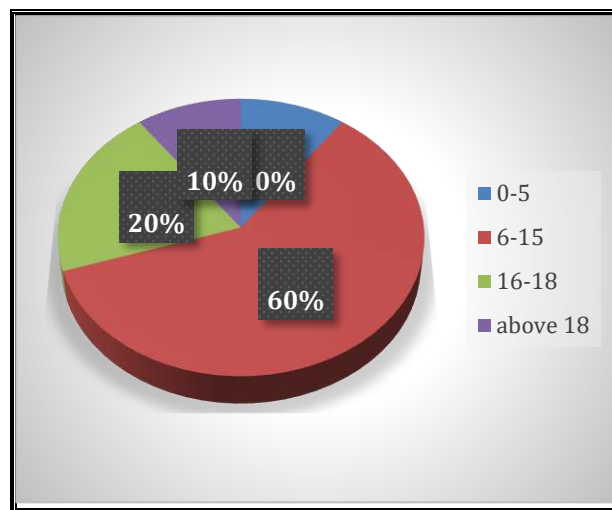


Among children in need of care and Protection (CNCP), the number of males (7) are higher than the number of girls (3).



### **Age of Children in Need of Care and Protection (CNCP)**

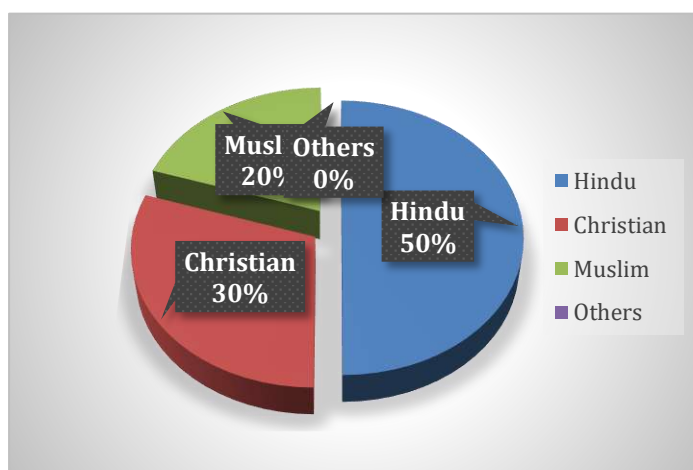

Children those who are in need of care and protection (CNCP) are going through different types of problems. Among CNCP seven of them have poor family background and five of them are facing family dysfunction. Four children are suffering from physical-mental health issues. Another important problem is alcoholism in the family. In five children's family their fathers are alcoholic. Moreover, three of the children in CNCP category (Children in Need of Care and Protection) have the habit of substance abuse.

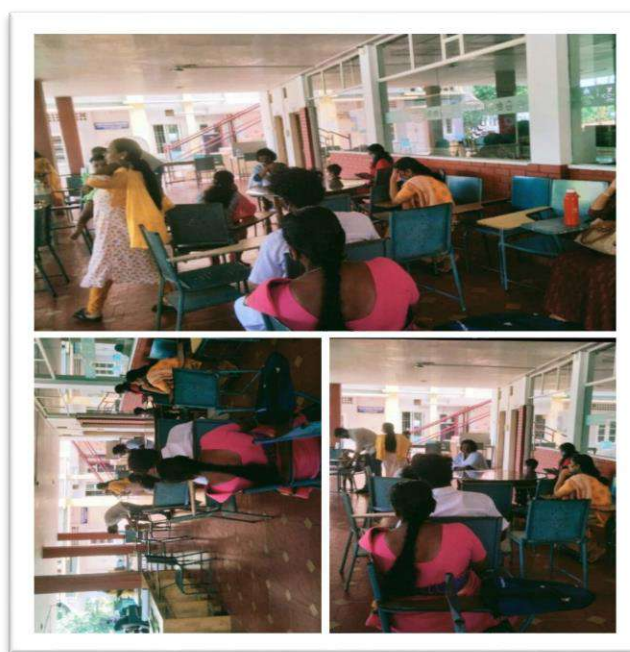

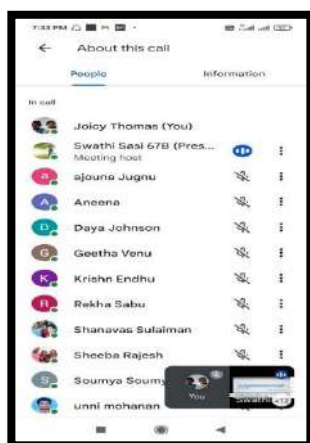


**Picture: 8 Parent Management training Session for the parents of CSA and CNCP (21/02/2022)**

## **Conclusion**

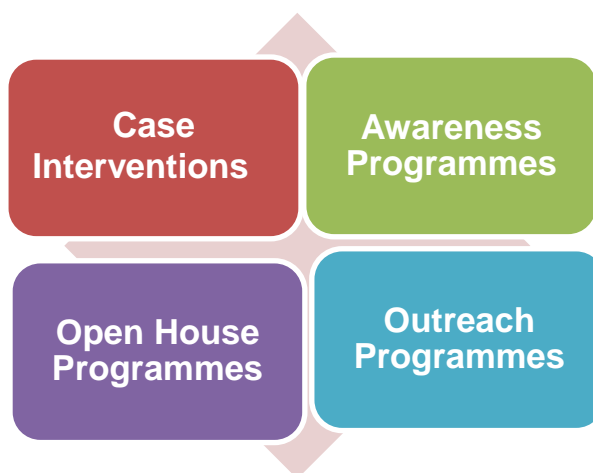
Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA) and Children in Need of Care and Protection (CNCP) are the most important groups of children in difficult circumstances to be addressed. Rajagiri outREACH is the Child Line Support Organization in Malappuram District. Rajagiri outREACH provides Child Abuse Case Interventions, Awareness Programmes, Outreach Activities and Open-house Programmes, Protection of Child Rights, etc.

Childline is a national, 24 hour emergency telephonic helpline in order to provide care and protection to children who are in need. The Nodal office of child line is set up at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences and a Support Organization of Childline is set up at Malappuram District. Childline covers schools, anganawadis and residential areas to identify issues faced by children and find solutions for the same. It provides services like case interventions, open-house programmes, workshops, awareness on child rights and acts passed by the Central and State governments with regard to children.

## 4.G. OUTREACH DROP IN CENTRE

*Supported by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India*



The Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Project for the substance users supported by the National Institute of Social Defence under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India has successfully accomplished its second year during the period 2021-2022.

**Outreach and Drop-In Centre (ODIC)** is a community-based facility for substance users initiated by the **National Institute of Social Defence (NISD) under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India**. The ODIC caters to individuals, particularly youth who use various substances and those who have the least access to resources. ODIC is client-focused with an ultimate goal to prevent youth in the community from initiating substance use, and also to help the current users to become sober by taking treatment. ODIC is a doorway for substance users to a non-threatening and caring environment. It is a hub for all services, which substance users can access as per his or her need and convenience. The ODIC must be within close proximity of substance users and located in the hotspot area of the substance users. In addition to addressing the health needs of the substance users, ODIC will support their right to treatment and care services that are respectful and non-discriminatory. Other activities necessary for substance users will also be conducted in the ODIC (like recreational activity, group therapy, individual counselling, family counselling etc.) The ODIC will also provide psychosocial support, a space for rest and recreation, as well as access to other substance users and OUTREACH WORKERS for support and care through mutual sharing of experiences.

ODIC provides a safe, supportive and normalising environment for individuals labelled as "Substance Users" in the community, especially among the youth who are isolated in society, and to whom even sheltered employment settings are not meeting their needs. It would provide an atmosphere of acceptance where individuals have a sense of belonging and grow in self-worth, dignity and self-respect. It would emphasise helping individuals feel autonomous and having the capacity to make decisions. An important outcome is these individuals develop a sense of



usefulness, increase their feelings of well-being, and minimise their risk of serious health problems that may have led to hospitalisation.

**Target Group:** Vulnerable young population prone to substance use and using substances in selected geographical areas.

## **1.2 OBJECTIVES**

- To reduce substance use in the community.
- To protect and promote human and youth rights.
- To ensure that services are accessible, community-based and differentiated along a continuum of care including psychosocial support for substance users, their primary caregivers and families.
- To conduct outreach activities among vulnerable young populations in the community for the prevention of substance use.
- To provide a safe and secure drop-in space for substance users in the community, which would have provisions for screening, assessment and counselling.
- To render psychosocial interventions particularly based on behavioural approaches including Adolescent Community Reinforcement Approach, Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, Contingency Management, Motivational Enhancement Therapy, Twelve-step facilitation therapy and Group therapy.
- To provide referral and linkage to treatment, care and rehabilitation services for substance dependents.

## **1.3 PROGRAM STRUCTURE**

- The centre will be led by trained staff, which will be part of a multidisciplinary team that is adequately trained in the delivery of evidence-based interventions.
- Comprehensive outreach, screening and counselling system consisting of evidence-based and integrated psychosocial interventions will be provided.
- Basic services including outreach, drop-in and counselling support to the clients.
- Basic health services and medical check-ups and follow up support by a part-time Physician.

- Render psychosocial interventions and linkage for treatment, rehabilitation and vocational training.

The Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team comprises of a Centre In-charge-cum Counsellor who is in-charge of supervising the centre activities, setting up a routing monitoring mechanism or supervision of outreach works and three Outreach Workers, who are responsible for visiting community and hotspots, distributing IEC material in the community, maintaining documentation/records and a Part-time Doctor for the treatment of substance dependent clients and advising for investigation and referral.

Rajagiri outREACH ODIC Project Team had conducted the following Activities:

### **ONE TO ONE SESSIONS**

Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Team conducted **447 one to one sessions** during the period of 2021-2022. Through the one to one sessions, ODIC Outreach workers identified the drug users who require doctor's consultation, individual counselling and family counselling and provided services as per the client's needs. The services provided to every client at ODIC are clearly recorded in the corresponding files

### **GROUP SESSIONS**

The Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team conducted **10 group work sessions** with substance users during the period 2021-2022.

Outreach Worker (ORW) gave awareness about the harmful effects of Substances like Tobacco, Alcohol, and Marijuana. The Outreach Worker (ORW) discussed personal care and ideal family life to the clients. ORW took feedback from each individual. As an initial analysis of group work, Outreach Worker (ORW) identified that group members need more motivation to reduce the use of drugs.



The ODIC Team Conducted a group work session on Google Meet (Online platform) at 3.00 PM on 11 May 2021. **2** Drug Users attended the group work session. The topic of the session was ‘Time management during Lockdown for DU’s and Anger Management. The Outreach Worker (ORW) asked the group members to introduce each other and build rapport by conducting

activities. The Outreach Worker (ORW) discussed the lockdown situation and how this time could be utilized usefully. The Outreach Worker(ORW) gave awareness about the issues faced by individuals during the lockdown period and how these could lead to frustration and anger issues. ORW took feedback from each individual so that more could be done for them in the next session.



The ODIC Team Conducted a group work session at Varapuzha Police Station at 10.30 AM on 22 September 2021. **5** Drug Users attended the group work session. The session's topic was 'Drug Usage, Legal Provisions of Drug Use and career plans of DU's '. The outreach Worker (ORW) asked the group members to introduce each other and build rapport by conducting simple activities. The Outreach Worker (ORW) discussed Drug use in adolescents and Legal provisions with regard to Drugs. The Outreach Worker(ORW) also discussed the career plans of the DU's and took feedback from each individual.



The ODIC Team Conducted a group work session at Ward 5, Eloor Municipality at 3.30 PM on 29 September 2021. **3** Clients attended the group work session. The topic for the session was 'Game and substance addiction and Academic Plans of DU's'. The Outreach Worker (ORW) asked the group members to introduce each other and build rapport by conducting activities. Outreach Worker (ORW) also discussed Game Addiction and Drug use in adolescents. The

Outreach Worker(ORW) also discussed the career plans of the clients and took feedback from each individual.



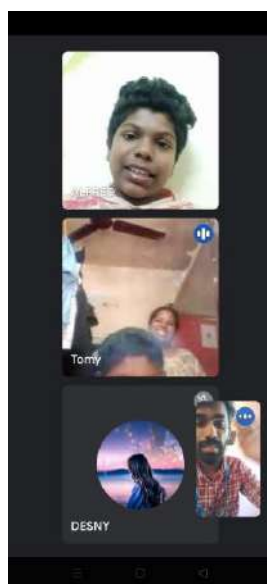

The topic of the session was **‘Harmful effects of Substance Use’**. The Outreach Worker (ORW) asked the group members to introduce each other and build rapport by conducting activities. Outreach Worker(ORW) gave awareness about the harmful effects of Substances like Tobacco, Alcohol, and Marijuana. Outreach Worker (ORW) discussed personal care and ideal family life to the clients. ORW took feedback from each individual.



The Outreach worker from the ODIC team conducted a group work session for clients from Govt. High School Binanipuram on 10th November 2021 from 10 am - 12 pm. 4 students from the High school attended the session. The session focused on 2 main types of addiction including **“Substance use and Screen Addiction among Adolescents”**. The Outreach worker (ORW) initiated the session by introducing the topic and goals of the group session followed by the activities. Activities included generating awareness about different types of addictions among

adolescents and how addictions develop. ORW took feedback from the group members at the conclusion.

The ODIC team conducted an online group work session for clients in Google meet. The session was focused on “**Screen Addiction and Family issues among Adolescents**”. The session was initiated by explaining the goals and objectives of the group and discussions were held within the group regarding the topic. The Outreach worker also shared prevention strategies and conducted a brief awareness session regarding different types of addiction. Feedback was also collected from the participants of the group session.



### **MAPPING OF SUBSTANCE USE HOTSPOTS**

The Outreach Drop-In Centre Project team conducted social mapping at Alangad and Kadamakudy Grama Panchayats in the Ernakulam district. Alangad Grama Panchayath has **21 wards** and Kadamakudy Grama Panchayath has **13 Wards**. All panchayat wards were divided among the 3 ORW's for conducting social mapping. Outreach Workers prepared social mapping of assigned wards with the support of Anganwadi teachers, Kudumbashree Members, representatives from the community, and local self-government authorities like Panchayat members. A map of the respective ward is drawn and major hotspots (where drug- users gather or use substances) are marked. Also, the Post Office, Banks, Hospitals, Clinics, Play Grounds, Religious Institutions, Major Roads, Government Offices, Colony, Beverage shops, Toddy Shops,



River, Bridges, Library, Youth Clubs, Factories, Company, and Community Facilities were marked in the map.

### **Process of Conducting Social Mapping by Rajagiri outREACH ODIC Team at Alangad Grama Panchayat**

The Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Project team conducted social mapping in all wards of Alangad Grama Panchayat from 13th July 2021 to 18th August 2021. Social mapping of all wards compiled into one map of Alangad Grama Panchayat by marking main hotspots and local resources with the support of CDS members, Anganwadi teachers, Police and Excise departments, and other local self-government authorities. Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Team identified 31 hotspots in Kottuvally Panchayat.

### **DOCTOR'S CONSULTATION AT RAJAGIRI outREACH ODIC OFFICE FOR SUBSTANCE USERS**

After identifying substance users from the community, the Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) team provided a Doctor's consultation at the Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) Office. Assessment and diagnosis of the substance users would be carried out by the doctor, and counsellor of the Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC). Assessments which are recorded on the initial visit of the client are basic medical history, information on the type of substance, mode and patterns of use, abstinence attempts in the past, help or treatment sought earlier and other risk behaviours.

Dr. Sanju George, Part-time Doctor of Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) who has years of experience in handling substance-dependent clients visits the centre weekly. The Doctor is responsible for:

- Assessing common physical and mental health problems
- Treatment (general, abscess management if needed etc.) and healthy lifestyle



- Advising for investigation and referral
- Educating the staff on medical issues.

49 substance users consulted the doctor at Rajagiri outREACH ODIC Office during the period 2021-2022.

### **INDIVIDUAL, GROUP AND FAMILY COUNSELLING**

Rajagiri outREACH, ODIC Office provides Individual, Group and Family Counselling for Substance users and their family members or caretakers

### **FOLLOW UP CARE INCLUDING FAMILY VISITS OF DRUG USERS**

Outreach Workers (ORWs) conducted follow-ups through phone calls and house visits. In each follow-up, Outreach Workers provided interventions according to the client's stage of change of substance use. **131 Follow-up sessions** were conducted during the period of 2021-2022 by Outreach Workers. **35 house visits** were conducted during the period 2021-2022.

### **RAJAGIRI outREACH, DROP-IN CENTRE FACILITIES FOR DRUG USERS**

Rajagiri outREACH, ODIC office has all the facilities like recreation room, counselling room and medical room for the drug users. The ODIC Team provided outpatient treatment services for substance use-related issues and psychiatric treatment support.

## REFERRAL SERVICES

With the provision of outpatient services for substance use-related issues, Rajagiri outREACH ODIC Office also provided the referral services to the clients. Based on the assessment of Outreach Workers, 16 of the clients were referred to Lourdes Hospital Ernakulam, Don Bosco Hospital North Paravur, Mukti Sadan De-Addiction Pookatupady, Jawahar De-Addiction Centre Kottayam, General Hospital Ernakulam, Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church Medical College (MOSC) Kollencherry and Rajagiri Family Counselling Centre (FCC) during the period 2021-2022.



## NETWORK BUILDING

Rajagiri outREACH, ODIC team kept a network building list to add the details of personnel whenever the team meets new personnel as part of the community programme or other activities. Network building helped the ODIC team to create new bonds with community institutions and stakeholders which progressively leads to generating awareness through Awareness programs and campaigns within the community and identifying Drug Users (DU's) from the community. Outreach Drop-In Centre (ODIC) keeps a list of **190 personnel** in the network building till now.

## **OTHER ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED BY ODIC**

### **World Environment Day**

The ODIC team observed World Environment Day on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2021. The ODIC team motivated DU's and their family members to plant a tree and participate in the campaign. The campaign was named "Self with a Plant". Considering the covid-19 protocols in place by the state, the campaign was conducted online. The ORW's collected photos from DU's after giving prior notice about the campaign. The collected pictures of DU's and their family members planting saplings of various plants were put together and created into a video. This video was also shared on social media and the message was spread across.

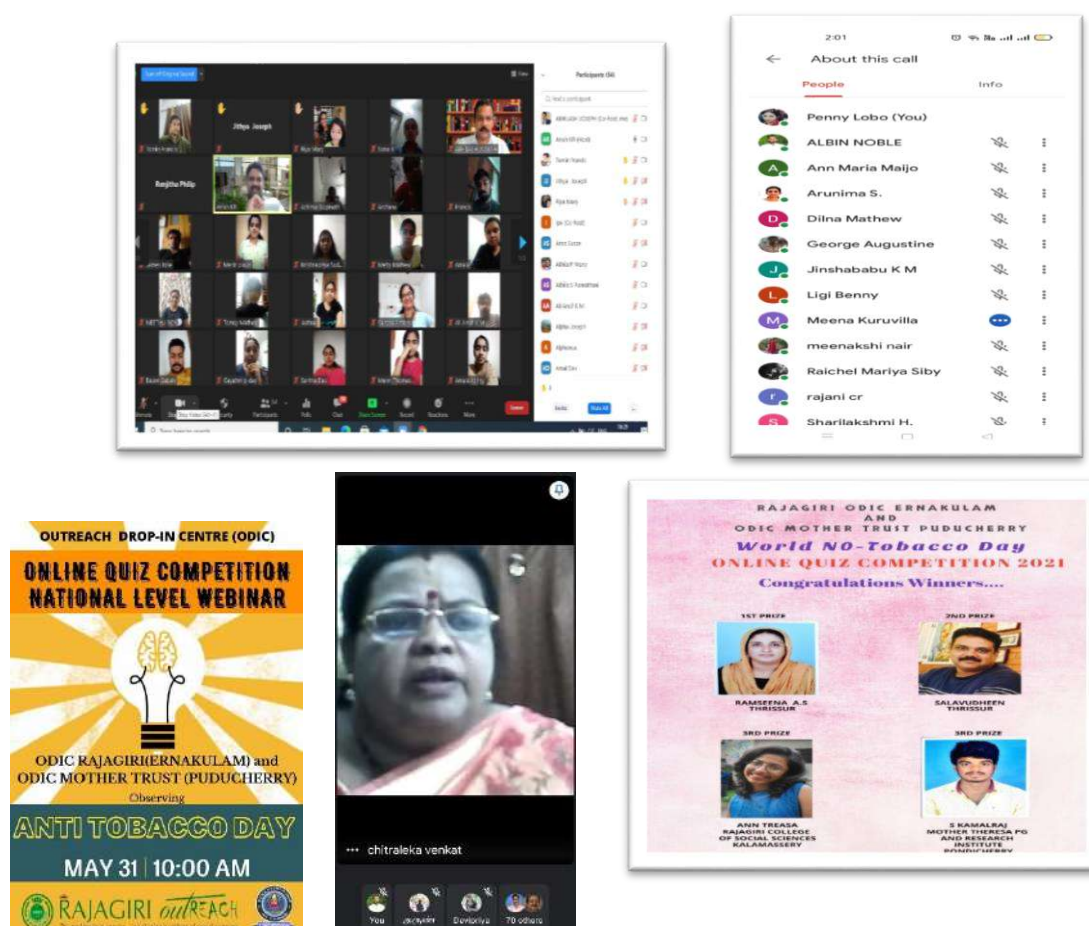
### **Observation of Anti-tobacco day**

### **Observation of International Day against drug abuse and illicit trafficking**

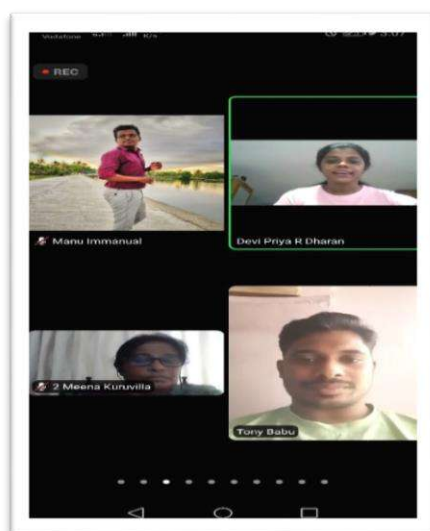

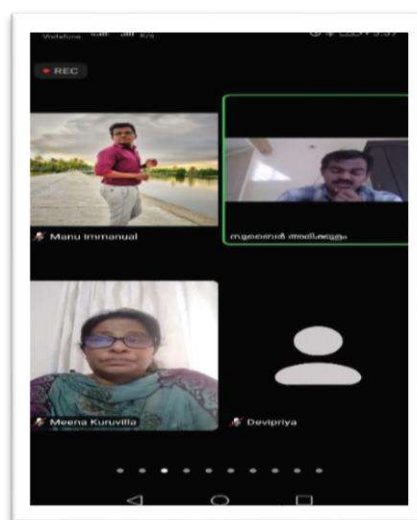


Meena Kuruville, Project Director of Rajagiri outREACH, welcomed all the participants and dignitaries.

The session was conducted in collaboration with the ICDS Aalangad Panchayath. The workshop fulfilled the WHO Life skills training manual. Students were divided into groups after conducting the icebreaking activity. ORW Krishnakumar and student interns from Rajagiri College of Social Sciences handled the sessions. The sessions and activities with regard to improving communication skills and critical creative thinking were initiated with regard to life skills. As per the feedback given by the teachers and the students, the session was very interactive and informative. ORW Jomol Johnson and ORW Manu Immanuel handled the session. Mrs. Preethy (Anganwadi Teacher) introduced the team to the gathering. The sessions and activities with regard to improving self-awareness were initiated with regard to life skills. As per the feedback given by the teachers and the students, the session was very interactive and useful. There were 19 participants who attended the workshop.

### **Exposure Visit to Nirmal Nikethan Mukthisadan, Angamaly, Ernakulam**

The ODIC Team members visited Nirmal Nikethan Mukthisadan on 16 July 2021. It is the first government-approved De-addiction centre to support female patients in Kerala. The centre is sponsored by the Social Justice Department, Govt of India, Kerala. The project and its activities are under the supervision of the Director – Dept. of Social Justice, Ernakulam District. The De-Addiction Programme provided at the centre is an inpatient short-stay treatment of 31 to 90 days. The ODIC team interacted with the Project Director and Public Relations Officer who explained the working and activities of Nirmal Nikethan Mukthisadan. The officials also provided the ODIC Team to visit the patients at the centre. The ODIC Team also shared the IEC Material of the ODIC Project with the Project Director.

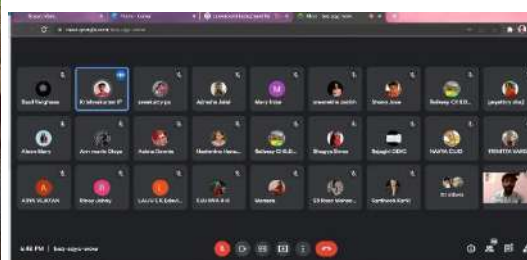

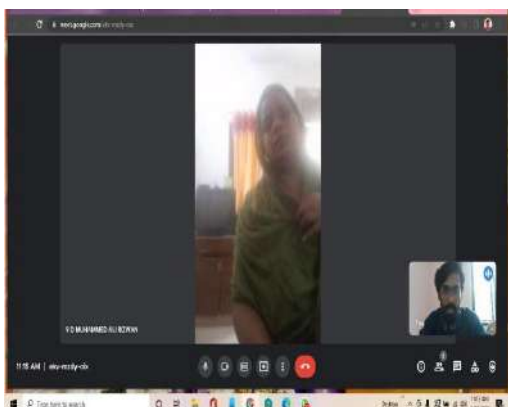

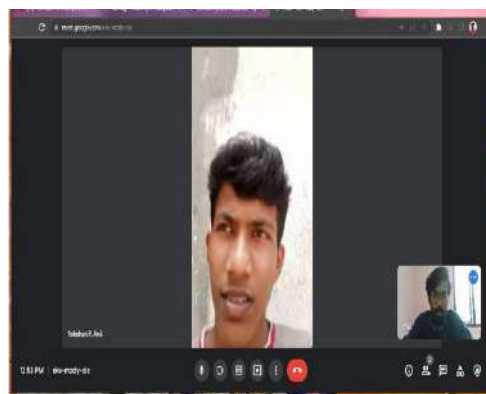

#### 4.H. RAJAGIRI outREACH COMMUNITY BASED PEER LED INTERVENTION (CPLI) AT KOZHIKODE

*Supported by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India*



Community based Peer-Led Intervention (CPLI) is a project initiated by National Institute of Social Defence (NISD) under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment and is implemented by RAJAGIRI outREACH, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), Kalamassery, Cochin, Kerala.

CPLI Project activities are implemented in the identified vulnerable districts as a focused preventive measure to curb the menace of drug abuse. The target group is mainly vulnerable adolescents and youth in the community of selected districts. The project mobilises Peer Educators (PEs) from the local community with the help of Anganwadi Teachers, ward members and localities. The selected Peer Educators undergo the registration process and training programs. These trained Peer Educators focus on creating awareness among the focused group called Peer Volunteers (PVs). The Peer Volunteers and Peer Educators will engage with their Peer Groups and community members under the supervision of CPLI Project Team to create awareness and prevent the abuse of drugs in that community. The Project Team has an Area Coordinator and two Trainer cum counsellors. They provide required trainings and other professional support for the Peer Educators and to the community directly. The team also render psychosocial interventions including educational sessions on ill effects of drug abuse, risk assessment on drug use among youth and linkage for treatment rehabilitation.

Rajagiri outREACH CPLI Project Office was set-up at Kozhikode on 13/08/2020, with the support of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi, Government of India. CPLI-NISD, Project had officially launched its activities on 15th June 2020 at Kozhikode District. And the project has successfully completed two years of making changes in the community.

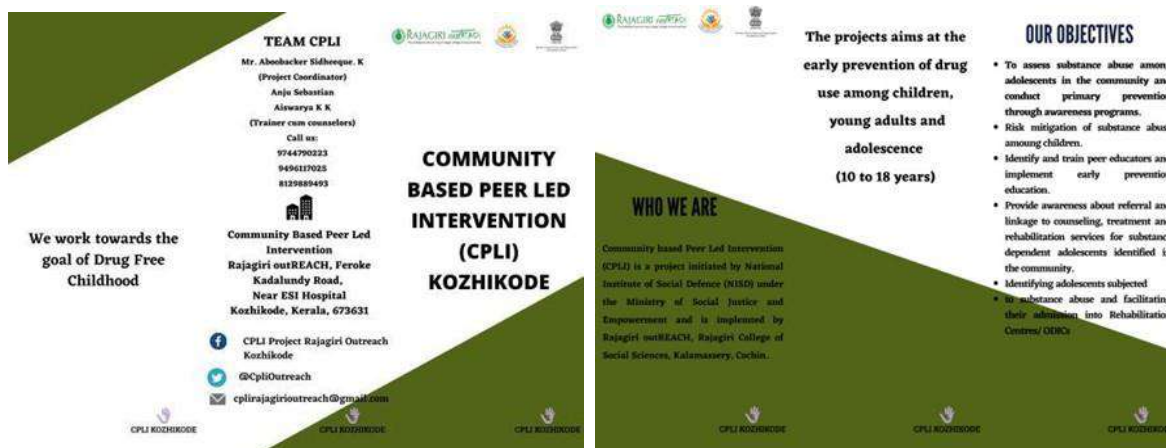

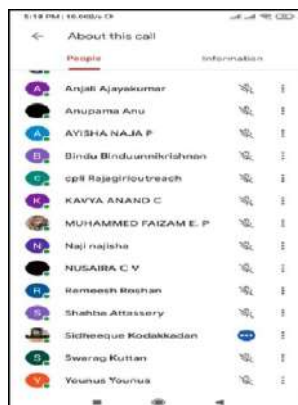


## g) Online activities During COVID-19 Period

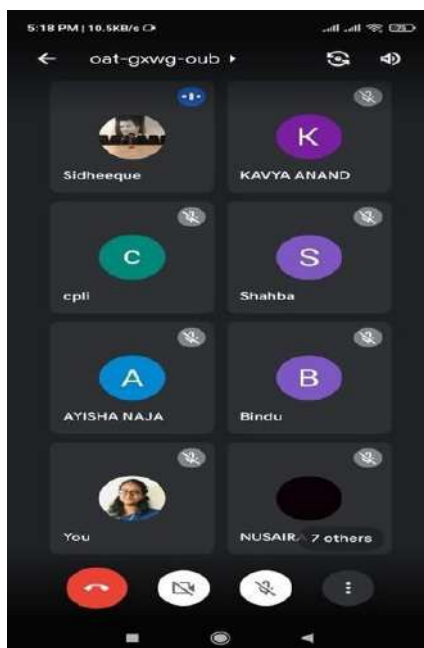
### → Monitoring of Peer Educators Session

### → Organised online session on “Harmful Effects of Drugs on Society” for Peer Educators

Community Based Peer-Led Intervention (CPLI), initiated by the National Institute of Social Defense, under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, has conducted a Session for Peer Educators on the **Harmful effects of Drugs on Society** through Google meet on 18<sup>th</sup> May 2021, 5 pm – 6 pm. It was oriented to the newly recruited Peer educators from the community.

There were 20 PEs who had successfully attended the training. Adverse effects of drug use affect not only individuals who abuse drugs, but also their family members and friends, as well as their education, community, various businesses, and government resources. While many of these cannot be quantified, our society is very deep into drug use. The reasons were discussed for the increase in drug use among children in the society, Symptoms of intoxication in children and society, Methods of preventing drug use in children and society and also discussed NDPS Act (Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985). The session was handled by Mr. Aboobacker Sidheeque, Aiswarya K.K. and Anju Sebastian helped make this session a success. The session had ended with the Question & Answer session and vote of thanks by 6.00 pm.

### → Online Life Skill Training Programme

Community Based Peer-Led Intervention (CPLI), initiated by National Institute of Social Defense, under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, has conducted a life skill training program through Google meet on 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2021 from 5-6 pm. It was oriented to the newly recruited Peer educators from the community. There were 18 Peer Educators who had successfully attended the training. Aiswarya K.K. and Anju Sebastian, Trainer cum Counsellors had conducted the training for one hour. The major contents included were defining life skill education, need of life skill in becoming a better young adult and also for transforming the peer volunteers associated with the peer educators. It helped in better strategies of implementation and associated with primary prevention activities of drug abuse. Each life skill was explained in detail with suitable examples from the field.

Life skills are abilities for adaptive and positive behaviour that enables individual to deal effectively with demands and challenges of everyday life. It has a great role in drug education and drug abuse prevention. The skills contribute to the promotion of personal and social development, the projection of human rights and the prevention of health and social problems. The purpose of life skill education is to reinforce existing knowledge, positive attitudes and values, pro-social and healthy skills and behaviour. Also, to prevent or reduce myths and misinformation, negative attitudes and risky behaviours. It aims at the promotion of responsible behaviours, self-confidence, equality and the prevention of prejudice and abuse. The process of reflection is a vital component of the learning process of peer educators and peer volunteers.



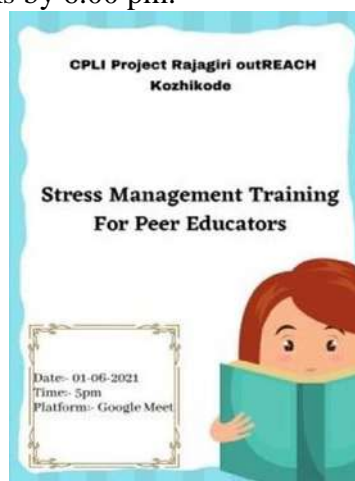
**CPLI Team conducted Online Life Skill Training Programme on 27.05.2021**

The consequences of drug use are affected by three main factors- personal factors (the reason for using the substances), social or environmental factors (the social context in which the substance is used) and drug factors (characteristics, nature and effect of the drug itself). Life skill-based education for drug use prevention addresses the first two factors with personal and interpersonal skills and through the decision-making process addresses drugs in meaningful and socially relevant way. The first five life skills were explained by Ms. Aiswarya and the later ones have been oriented by Ms. Anju. The training had a Question- Answer session as well towards the end. It had concluded by 6.00 pm. Mr. Aboobacker Sidheeque, Co-ordinator, had conveyed the vote of thanks.

### → **Training on Stress Management for Peer Educators**

CPLI Project team had conducted a **Stress Management Techniques Training** through Google meet on 01 June, 2021 from 5-6 pm. It was oriented to the newly recruited Peer educators from the community. There were 17 PEs who had successfully attended the training. Stress is a normal human reaction that happens to everyone. Stress can be positive, keeping the person alert, motivated and ready to avoid danger.

The major causes of adolescent stress and pressure are peer pressure, pressure to succeed academically, uncertainty about the future, parental pressure and family issues, etc. The symptoms of stress can be physical, psychological and social. They can be aches and pains, exhaustion or trouble sleeping, dizziness, BP shoot outs, anxiety or irritability, depression, panic attacks, sadness, smoking and usage of drugs. Elimination of stress is almost impossible but management is the solution. The strategies can be short term; long term, fast acting and problem focused coping strategies. Exercise regularly, relaxation activities, positive thinking, laughter, aroma therapy, balanced diet, diaphragmatic breathing, sleep management, leisure time, self-care, etc. These were the techniques explained in detail. The session was handled by Ms. Anju Sebastian. Ms. Aiswarya K.K., introduced the World No - Tobacco Day observation activities, especially the poster preparation, video of Peer Educators sharing, etc. Mr. Aboobacker Sidheeque, had explained the plan of World Environmental Day Observation by CPLI Team. The session had ended with the Question & Answer session and vote of thanks by 6.00 pm.

#### i) Environment Day Observation

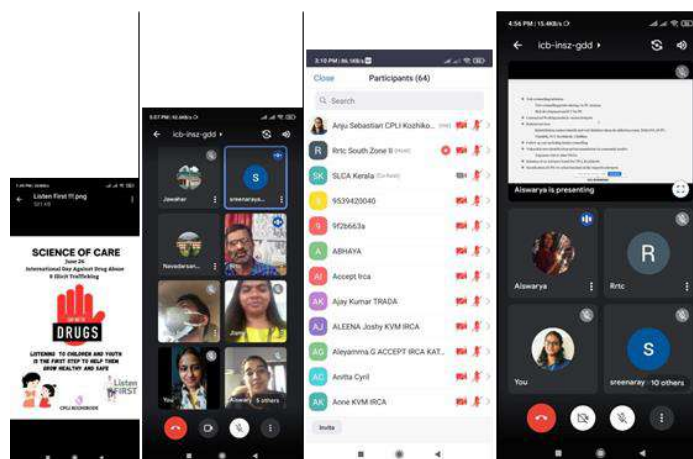

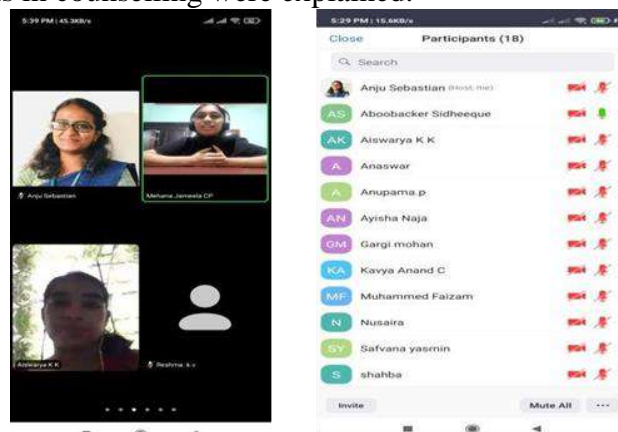

#### **s) Conducted Project Impact Assessment**

The project impact assessment had been conducted on the 7th of October 2021 by sharing the prepared questionnaire among the Peer Educators and collecting the responses. Response from all the twenty Peer Educators had been collected and then shared with the peer volunteers of each peer educator. By the end of the quarter, the Assessment was conducted once again with the same group of people and will compare the responses to assess the impact of the project. This is an innovative intervention taken by the CPLI Calicut team, to understand and showcase the impact and relevance of the project among the children and community and to what extent the project helped to create awareness about drugs and drug-related assistance. The exit survey of IAT (Impact Assessment Tool) had been conducted by the end of the quarter, and the findings clearly point out the awareness creation among the community especially peers.

#### **t) Follow up of Peer Educators**

The Trainers cum Counsellors (TCC) contacted the Peer Educators regularly and supervised and follow up on their activities with Peer Volunteers. Based on the training sessions received from the Area Coordinator, TCCs design their own training sessions and delivered sessions to their assigned Peer Educators. These Peer Educators in turn delivered training sessions to the Peer Volunteers assigned to them. The TCC scheduled all these activities on a weekly basis at the beginning of the week, monitored the activities throughout the week and reported to the Area Coordinator at the end of each week. To date, TCC had delivered 20 sessions to the Peer Educators

and the Peer Educators have delivered a total of 780 sessions (Sum total of individual sessions taken by the twenty PEs).

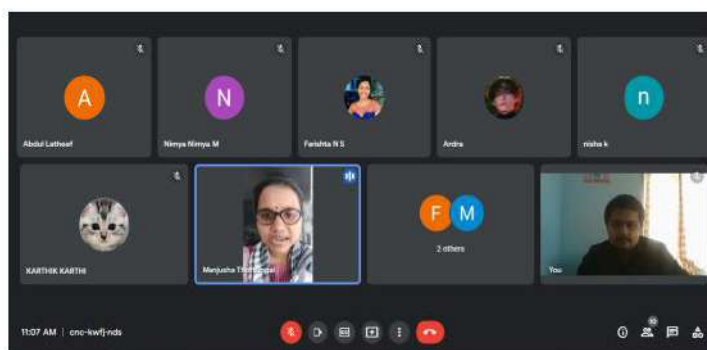

The activities of the fourth quarter at Ramanattukara Municipality were officially started with this orientation program.



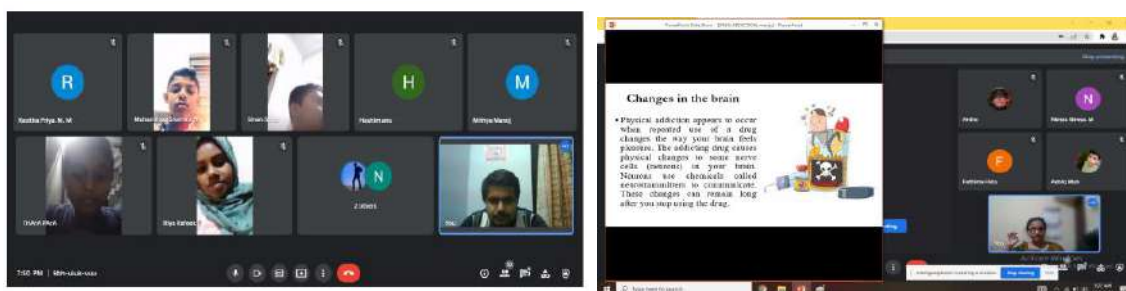

CPLI Project team has designed a new logo, which communicates the concept of the project more effectively

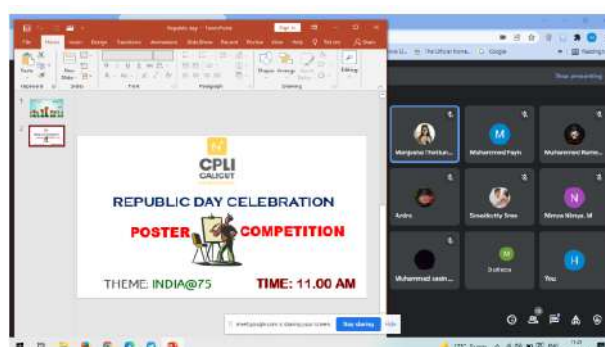


The logo has a child holding a balloon led by an adult.

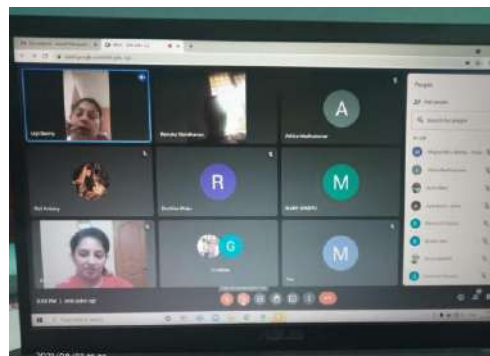

## Success Story of Women Entrepreneurs - Supported by K.P. Paul Foundation

### 1. Radhika Divakaran, 55 Entrepreneurship: Tailoring



Radhika, one of the Women Beneficiaries has a hobby of stitching. She is 55 years old. When her two grown-up children moved out of the home, Radhika decided to expand her informal hobby of stitching and tailoring, a skill she had honed with years of practice, into a full-blown business. Radhika heard about the K.P. Paul Foundation's loan program from other tailors in her neighborhood who had been beneficiaries of this program, and so she decided to apply for a loan herself.

In 2017, she received a loan of Rs.30,000/- with which she bought a cutting table, textiles, tailoring tools, and a fan to keep the workroom in her home cool. Although there were many other tailors in her neighborhood, Radhika made the astute decision to specialize in making and tailoring nighties, so that she could stand out from the competition and corner a niche market.

This decision paid off, when she received her loan, Radhika had dreamed of opening up a shop of her own, and within two years she was already able to realize this dream. Since starting her business, Radhika has bought another sewing machine and readymade clothes from a wholesale market. But most importantly, in April 2019 she expanded her workspace into her own store located right in front of her home, built on land owned by her husband, who is a cook.

Since opening her shop, Radhika has enjoyed the patronage of 20 to 25 individual customers per month. She has also partnered with one dress shop that commissions her to craft cute and comfortable nighties from fabric provided by the shop. When she receives bulk orders, Radhika employs the help of two local women to keep up with demand.

With the profits accrued from her shop, Radhika has invested in her son's education, as well as paid for other familial expenses such as the delivery of her daughter's baby. However, most

of her profit goes back into maintaining her shop, as her husband's income is sufficient to meet their daily living expenses.

Radhika's self-confidence and pride in her work have blossomed as a result of her receiving this loan and establishing her shop. Much of her success is owed to her supportive husband, who allowed her to build a shop on his property, and her wise market-minded decision to specialize in making nighties.

## **2. Ms. Jainy Sabu, 41** **Entrepreneurship: Cow rearing**



Ms. Jainy Sabu, aged 41 years runs a cow-rearing enterprise with the support of her husband Mr. Sabu. Her husband does vegetable farming. She hails from Melkunel (H), Therumkuzhi Asharikad P.O, Nadathara panchayat of Thrissur district. She has studied till SSLC and now she is a successful Entrepreneur. She has three children. Her eldest son Amal Sabu has completed plus two, her younger son, Arun Sabu has completed 10<sup>th</sup> Std, and her youngest son, Abin Sabu has completed 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Her family is very much supportive.

Jainy already had a cow. After receiving a loan of Rs.1,00,000 in the year 2020 from K. P. Paul Foundation through Rajagiri outREACH, she bought a cow and rebuilt its shelter with that money. The profit earned is used to meet the expenses of her house, buy her medicine, pay the fees of her children and also to pay the interest of the loans. In a week, she earns an income of Rs.4500/-. Apart from the expense of Rs.2,500/- for its fodder, she receives profit of Rs.2,000/- per week. She receives 21 liters of milk from two cows. After taking necessary milk for household needs, she sells the remaining milk to Milma Society for Rs.38/- per liter. As her neighbors also have cows, she sells only to the society. Cow dung is used as manure for farming and rubber.

But since COVID-19 started, cow rearing is her only income. In the midst of pandemic too, she is able to sell milk to society. She says that “Due to this loan from K.P. Paul Foundation, I could buy one more cow and build its shelter. Cow rearing is a good source of income with which I meet all the expenses of my family. In every aspect, it is a success only without any losses.” Her own words are a reflection of Ms. Jainy being a successful entrepreneur.

Though we live in progressive time as we claim, women still face serious gender differences and is more so in the work as the number of working women is being steadily increased in the world.



The National Webinar on “**Unequal Pay: Gender Discrimination at Workplace**” will strive to achieve the following objectives:

## 6. PROGRAMMES FOR ELDERS

The Day Care Centre for the Elderly, is a non-institutional scheme namely **Pakalveedu** for the elderly, mainly functioning in Ernakulam District at Kothad, Kadamakkudy and Binanipuram. “Pakalveedukal” are functioning under the patronage of various Corporates, LSG’s, clubs, organizations, etc.

The emphasis is on non-institutional and Community Based Services (CBS) with the intention of integrating the elderly with the community. The purpose and basic principle of the approach is to assist the elderly who experience isolation, rejection and suffer from insecurity, anxiety and depression. The programme supports 350 elderly people through different centers. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic period and protocol the regular activities of the day care which included news paper reading, discussion on local reports, personal sharing, feature films shown on elders related issues, house visits, exposure visits, entertainment trips, reading, listening to music, games and yoga, counselling, motivational and awareness classes on health, relationships, etc., celebration of members’ birthdays, nutritious lunch, observation of occasions like International Elders’ Day, Gandhi Jayanthi, Onam, Ramzan, Christmas & New Year, Environment Day, were restricted but most of the programmes / activities were organized by Rajagiri outREACH Staff through online meetings/telecounselling. The service of a doctor once a week is provided at certain centers. The social workers from Rajagiri outREACH paid house visits to Pakalveedu members on regular basis to provide psycho social support and for providing health and nutrition kits to the senior citizens.

**Our first Senior Citizen Day Care Center (Pakalveedu) was established in Kothad Village in Ernakulam District in the year 1997. Currently the centers are functioning at Kothad, Kadamakudy and Binanipuram.**

The major programs conducted through the offline / online platform to the Pakalveedu Members were:

- International day for the Elderly
- Psycho Social Support / Telecounselling
- Class about old age care
- E-Observation of important festivals and days
- Class on Nutritious food
- Distribution of Health & Nutrition Kits
- House visits
- Leisure Trips
- Yoga

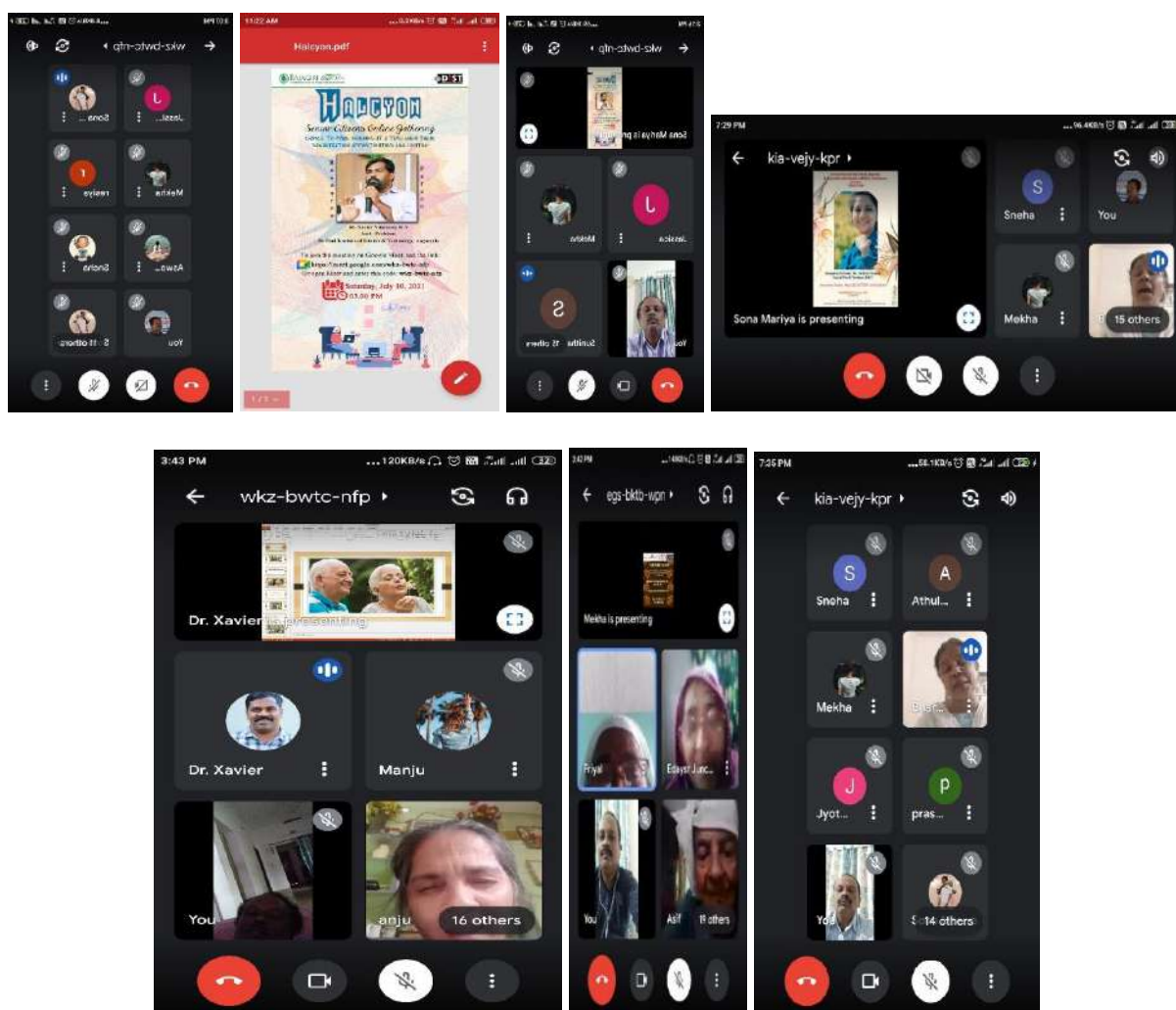

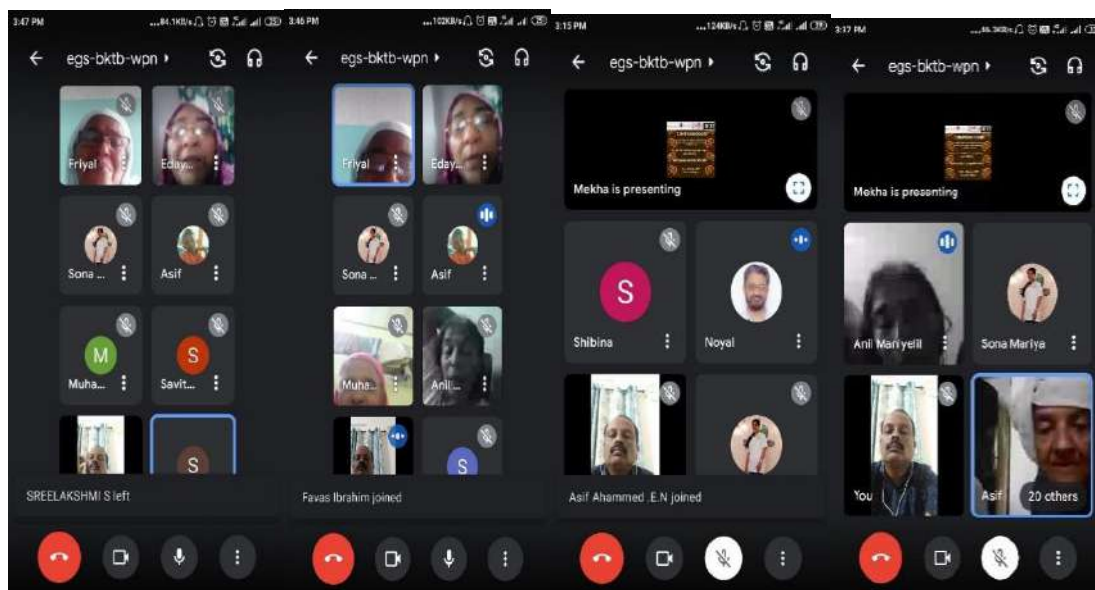

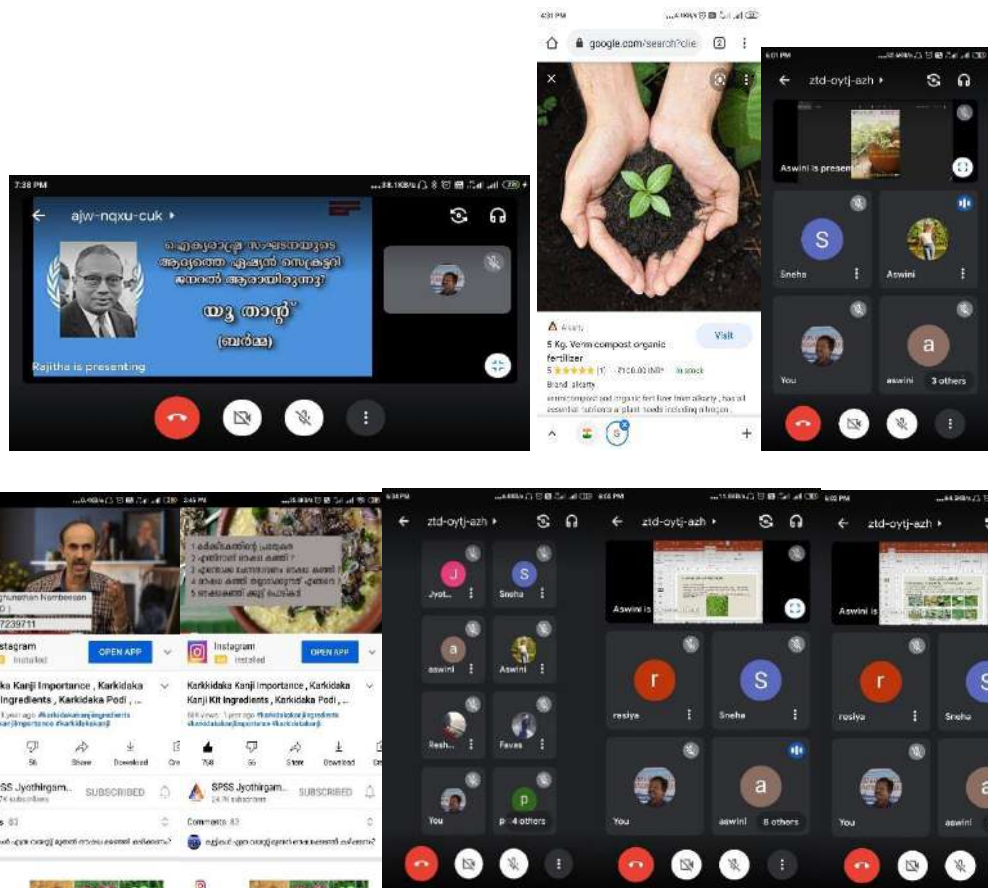

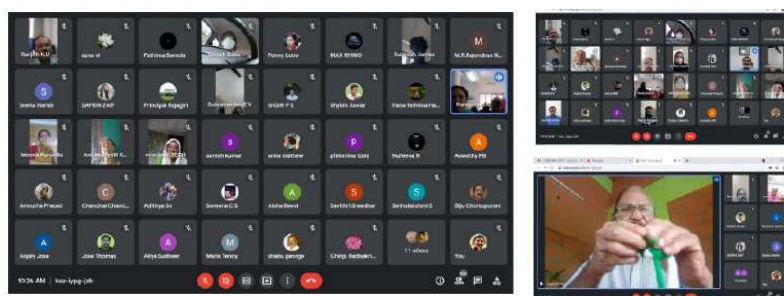

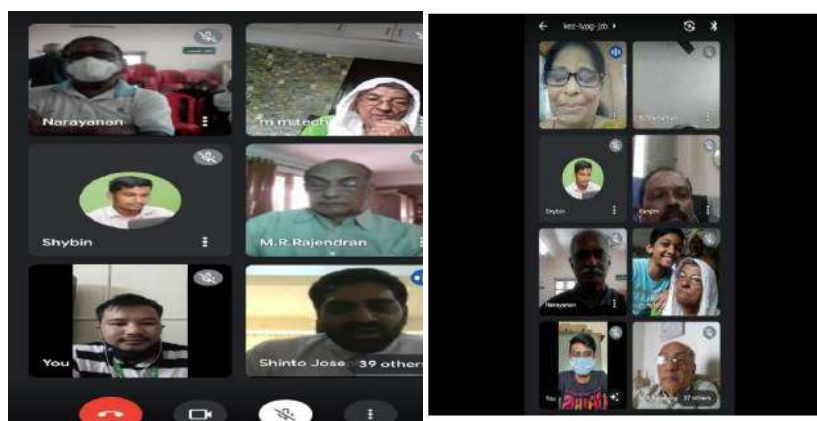


## Observation of World Elder's Day 2021 through Online

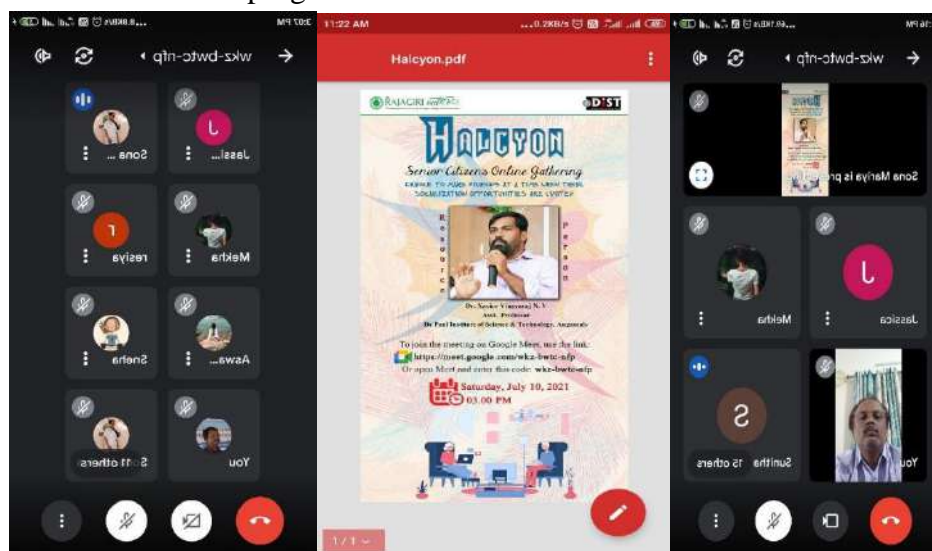


Christmas and New Year celebration at Kothad Elderly Day Care Centre on 21.12.2021

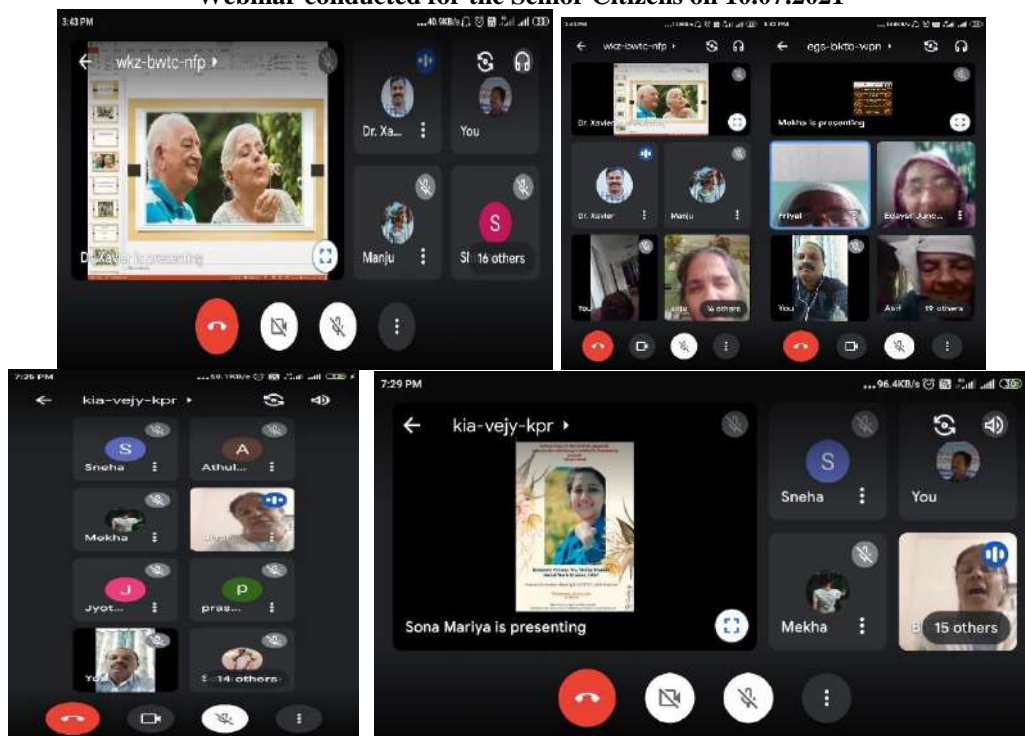

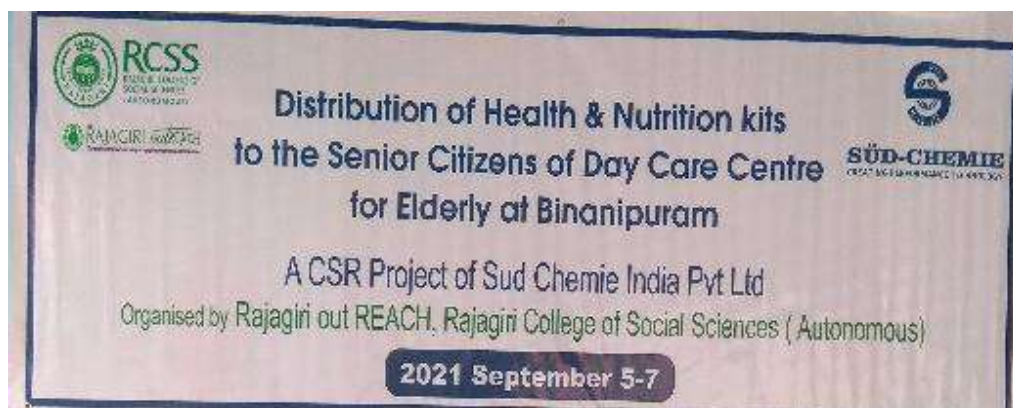

## 9. PROGRAMMES FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH



### **Suraksha Migrant Project – Prevention of HIV among Migrant Labourers in Ernakulam District (Perumbavoor & Kalamassery) Supported by Kerala State AIDS Control Society, Government of Kerala**

Rajagiri outREACH is the implementing agency for Suraksha projects functioning at Ernakulam and Perumbavoor sanctioned by Kerala State AIDS Control Society (KSACS), Government of Kerala and has been working for migrant labourers since September 2008. Along with HIV/AIDS prevention programme, health camps, health education, high risk group identification, STI screening, counseling, ICTC, mega-events, exhibitions, film shows, World AIDS Day observation, COVID-19 Relief Activities, etc. were conducted to prevent problems in health, sanitation, livelihood and hygiene. The main objective of this project is to reduce HIV/AIDS prevalence in Kerala targeting migrants who are residing in Ernakulam District. The project has reached out to **19933** migrants through contacts in the STI clinics and group meetings in labour camps during the period.

## SURAKSHA MIGRANT PROJECT, KALAMASSERY



**Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant:** Kerala has a rich experience in Targeted Intervention Program as the program started way back in 1996 and managed by different management units with the help of experienced technical professionals. The Program is designed to reduce the rate of HIV transmission among the Core Group viz. Female Sex Workers (FSWs), Men having Sex with Men (MSMs) and Injecting Drug Users (IDUs), Transgender & Bridge populations like Interstate Migrants and Long-Distance Truckers. The intervention among bridge group in Ernakulam district was taken over by Rajagiri outREACH Suraksha Migrant Project on 15th September 2008. Targeted Intervention (TI) focuses on Sexual Minorities who practice risky behaviour, to prevent and control the spread of HIV/AIDS among them and avert the spread of HIV/AIDS through high-risk groups to bridge the population the and general community. The Suraksha Projects are also aimed at behavioural modification among target communities, from unsafe sexual practices and injecting practices.

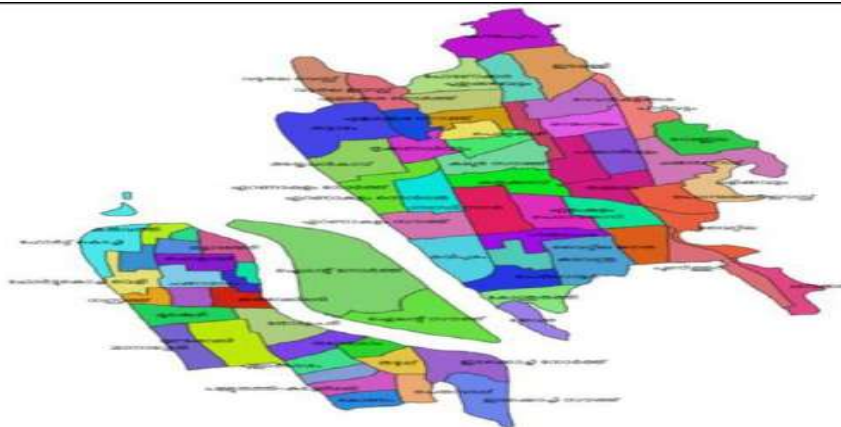
For decades, Migration has been a livelihood strategy for millions of rural poor in India. In addition to that, Kerala offers the best wage rate compared to the other states of the country. The high wage rates and the sustainable job opportunities have made Kerala one of the most sought-after destinations in the country. As per an estimate, nearly 5 lakh migrants are working and residing in Ernakulam district. Kochi is one of the fast-growing cities in our country and the financial capital of Kerala. Migration happens in all sectors starting from IT companies to daily wage workers. Migrants in Ernakulam are mostly related to construction work in companies and industries. People migrate from Orissa, Assam, Bihar and West Bengal, Jharkhand, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh come here and work here as supervisors, contractors and workers in these companies. Majority of them are residing at Kochi Corporation and its suburban towns like Kakkanad, Aluva, Kalamassery and Paravur scattered.

The general migrant population residing in the above-mentioned area is nearly 1-2.15 lakh. This was estimated through an assessment done with the interaction among primary and secondary stakeholders. Unfortunately, an accurate official data is not available with any of our government departments connected to Health, Labour, and allied services.

During a COVID-19 relief camp on 2021, 4 migrants from scattered were tested positive. So, the prevalence of HIV among migrants were spread not only in construction and industrial area, but also among the scattered migrants too. Therefore, the service delivery of the project has started among scattered migrants 6:4 (Scattered : construction & industrial) working in Ernakulam District.

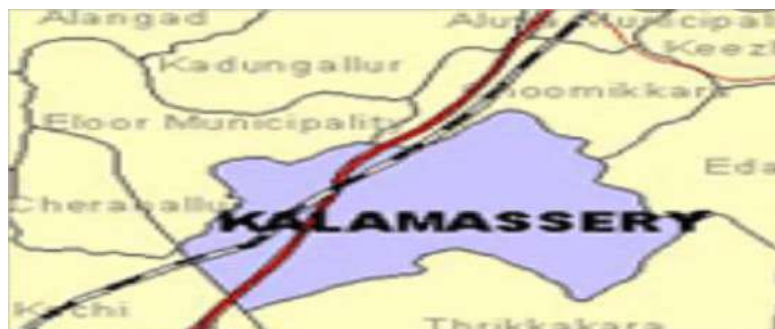

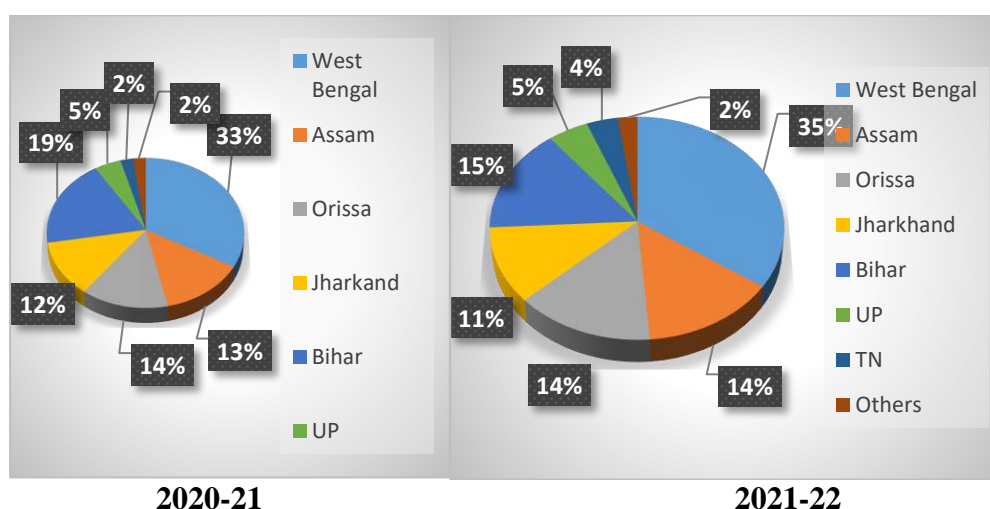
## **PROGRAMMES OF THE PROJECT**



### **Registration of High-Risk Migrants**

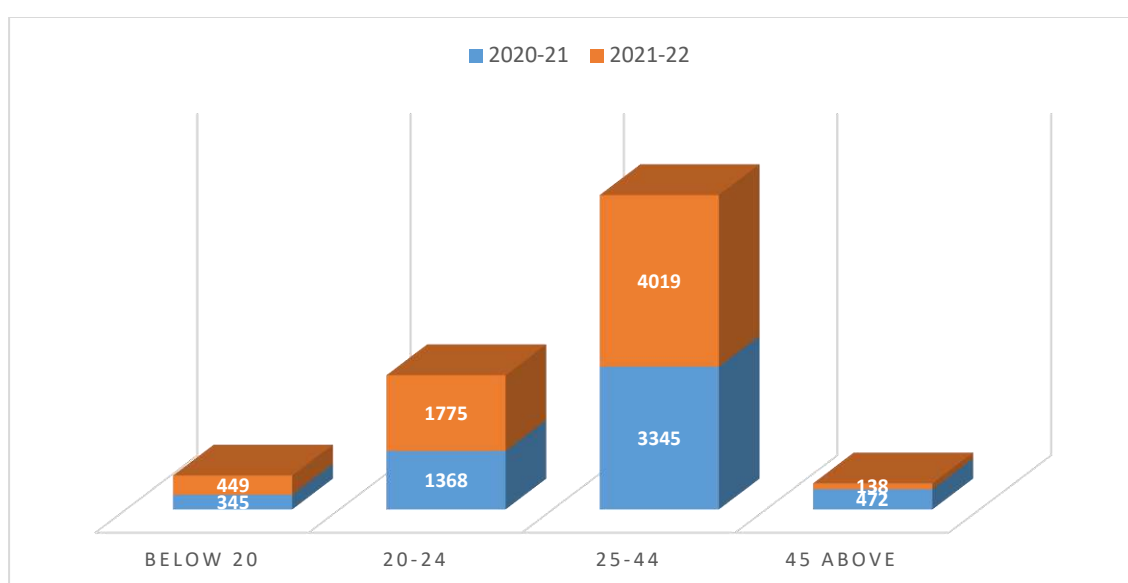
The registration of High-Risk Migrants can be done through health camps, counselling, and DIC (Drop In Centre). Out Reach Workers (ORWs) and Peer leaders (PLs) of the project, are providing awareness classes and Inter Personal Communication (IPC) sessions to find out the High Risk Migrants from the targeted population. Inter Personal Communication (IPC) sessions includes, awareness about HIV/AIDS, STI, Condom promotion, etc. One session takes 10-20 minutes with maximum number of 10 migrants. After the High Risk identification process, the migrants are screened and tested for HIV/AIDS. The project should deliver the services of the project to 10000 migrant populations per annum. Restrictions due to the pandemic situation badly affect the project to provide the services on various congregation points. The Second lockdown also affected the project to reach the services to the concerned population.

### Classification Of High-Risk Migrants According To Their Native States



From, High Risk Identification it is very evident that, majority of the high-risk migrants are from West Bengal (33% and 35% respectively). Whereas, the number of high-risk migrants commuting from Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand to Kerala remained almost static throughout the period. There is slight change in the number of migrants in Bihar, Orissa and Assam migrating to Kerala.

### Age-wise Risk Categorization



From the above graph, the vulnerability among 25-44 age groups is increasing as compared to the other category of age. Furthermore, a prevalence of high-risk population is also increasing as compared to both years. The ratio of the migrant population belongs to 45 and above age group is decreasing as compared to the other group. But the risk among below 20 age and 20-24 age category is increasing annually.



## Medical camps



The pandemic period results an inclination of conducting health camps on the particular period. Suraksh Migrant Project team conducted **120 medical camps during 2021-22 period**. In addition to that, collaboration with the labour department, National Health Mission, TB department and Local Self Government ameliorate the health camps more successfully. 12 doctors from different sectors accompanied the team during the health camps.

## Group sessions



Intimation of group session is one of the main roles of Out Reach Workers. The foremost aim of the group sessions is to identify High Risk Migrants form the targeted population. Outreach workers and Peer Leaders of the project provided **3891 sessions to the migrant population** of their concerned congregation points.

## Condom programming

Condom promotion is one of the major objectives of TI projects. Though, the project has 50 active condom outlets functioning in various areas of Ernakulam, Kakkannad, Kalamassery, Paravur and Aluva. Condom outlets include both traditional and non-traditional outlets. Traditional outlets include medical shop whereas, non-traditional includes, petty shop, theatre, construction site, industrial area, pan shop, mobile shop, etc. Each ORW and PL provides condoms as per demand in their particular area. The demand of condom distribution of the year has increased as compared to the previous year.

## **Mid Media**



Film shows are particularly helpful to acquaint the importance and to create and awareness about HIV/STI. Mostly, we are displaying “savadan” Hindi movie during the health camps. During the financial year **24 film shows were conducted.**

## **Advocacy and Networking**



Advocacy meetings were organized among the stakeholders for the successful implementation of the project. This meeting ensured participation and sought the support of Local Self Government Representatives, Association representatives, contractors and supervisors of the construction and industrial areas. During the financial year 2021-22, the project could organize **24 advocacy meetings** with various stakeholders.

## **Demand Generation Activity**



Demand Generation Activity is mainly conducted among secondary stakeholders and migrants to make them aware about the importance and need of the project. DGA meeting could help the

project to improve the opportunity to reach the services and activities to the population. **23 Demand Generation Meeting** could be conducted by the project during 2021-22.

### **Congregation Events**



Congregation events were particularly focused on the commemoration of special days like, World AIDS Day, Independence Day, TB Day, Drug Prevention Day, Diwali, International Women's Day, Holi, etc. It helped to improve the feeling and unity among the migrants and common population. As part of congregation events, the project could organize 8 congregation events during the financial year 2021-22.

### **TB Screening**

TB screening is mainly conducted through health camps. The migrants, those who are complaining about any symptoms of TB, will be referred for confirmatory test (CBNAAT). During this financial year, in collaboration between TB departments, migrants were directly screened and tested for TB. During this financial year **81 sample were collected** for CBNAAT test.



### **ICTC Testing**

In association with Integrated Testing and Counselling Centre (ICTC), project could organize 32 health camps during the financial year 2021-22. Various ICTCs functioning in Ernakulam district viz, Vengola, Fortkochi, Thripunithura, Mattanchery, Kalady, Paravur, Piravam, etc., associated with us during the health camps. The joint functioning of ICTCs and TI projects strengthen the service delivery of the project.



## **Review and Monitoring**

The project has already developed a proper monitoring system to improve the quality and achieve its objectives. As part of the regular monitoring, project is conducting weekly review and planning meetings of all the staff. The last week's activities were discussed by each staff and the project manager suggest recommendations to improve their quality of work. In addition to that, activities for the coming week were discussed and a plan was prepared for the same.

The monthly review and planning meeting were conducted every last week of the month in the esteemed presence of Project Director. In-order to have maximum coverage and impact on HIV prevention, the ORWs analyses their outreach services, which included, health camps, mega events, group sessions, film shows, condom distribution for the HRG as per the demand and ICTC testing. Each attendee presented their target vs achievement and field level hurdles. These meetings were very fruitful to assess the efficiency of the out-reach activities. The key suggestions and valuable supervision of the Project Director helped to enhance the entire program successfully.

Monthly Peer Leaders meeting was also organised by the project. Currently **14 Peer Leaders** are jointly working with the project. The activities of the previous month were discussed and activities for the coming month were planned during the meeting.

Monthly visits of the Project Officer from KSACS/TSU supporting the entire activities of the program and helped to rectify the gaps of the project. Moreover, monthly consolidated reports were sent to KSACS/TSU also improved the quality of the program.



## **HIV Positive**

During this financial year **2 PLHIV were identified** and linked to ART. Both of them are currently taking medicines from ART monthly and are linked with project. One HIV Positive was linked with the help of West Bengal TSU and currently he is taking medicine from the concerned ART.



All staff except Counsellor and an ORW got training from KSACS/TSU. Furthermore, project organising in-house training during each month to enhance and improve the knowledge regarding the project. During the financial year 2021-22, **Twenty Capacity Building Trainings** were conducted by KSACS/TSU and project respectively.



- Organised health camps in association with National Health Mission, Labour Department, Local Self Government and TB Department. This improves to reach more services to the migrant population (Malaria, HIV/AIDS, STI, TB screening, Leprosy).
- Provided tele-counselling for 318 migrants during the pandemic period.
- Organised health camp in association with MSM Suraksha project. Migrants from the destitute institution were screened and tested for HIV /AIDS.
- Attended Peer Educators meeting of Swantham FSW Suraksha Project to identify the spot of migrant workers those who are in contact with FSWs.
- 508 migrants were registered for E-shram program through various health camps.
- Co-ordinated and reported vaccination facilities for 282 migrants and they got vaccination free of cost.
- Conducted COVID-19 testing camp and 4 were tested as HIV Positive.
- Distributed 512 food kits and 23 medicine kits in association with NHM, Labour Department, Cochin Corporation and local bodies.
- In collaboration with the Kalamassery Industrial Association Area, the migrants who were engaged in different small-scale works received the services of the project.
- Formed a Doctor's Directory of 12 doctors associated with the project. So the availability of doctors is utilized at any time.

In between he got infected and severely affected with COVID-19 and was admitted to ICU and then moved to ventilator support. He died on 22/05/2021. Now the family is indebted for approximately Rs.10 lakhs which was spent for his treatment and also the housing loan, which has not yet been repaid completely. Olga's Brother has just completed his Diploma in Tourism and is undergoing training in a firm. Olga Maria is studying in 9th class at St. Philomina's High School, Koonammavu. The family had requested for support for her online education. So the aid was given as a support for Olga Maria's online education.

Gowri Shankar's elder brother has completed B.Com and is searching for a job. Gowri Shankar has completed 10th class and seeking admission for Plus One (11th ). The aid has been given for the family as an assistance for the admission of Gowri Sankar for Plus One.

Anitta's elder sister is doing her graduation and Anitta has completed 10th class this year with 85% marks. She is awaiting admission for 11th class (Plus one). The aid was given to Anitta as a support for joining in Plus one class.

## **INTRODUCTION**

The sudden and often inconsistent changes we have experienced during the COVID-19-19-19 pandemic may have led to many children and young people feeling uncertain. Many pupils may worry that things which used to feel safe and predictable, such as school, may no longer be something they can rely on. Many of the pupils are first timers to the school as well.

In Kerala, the schools were scheduled to restart on 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021, after the schools were shut down due to COVID-19-19-19 and the children will be exposed to school atmosphere after more than one and a half academic year. Most of the parents and children are very anxious about the reopening of schools during the pandemic situation. In this situation, it is very important to create awareness among the children, parents and the teachers, to lessen their anxieties, caused during COVID-19-19-19 pandemic.

This is the context which the Cochin Shipyard Ltd., Malayala Manorama and Rajagiri outREACH, Department of Social Work, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences, joined together to support the children in their smooth reintegration to schools in Ernakulam District with a campaign named as “**Adhyapadam Arogyam - Ente Vidyalayathilekku - Back to School Campaign**”.

During this campaign from 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021 to 11<sup>th</sup> November 2021, we could reach out to the schools students in 101 schools covering 7 Taluks viz., Kannayanur, Aluva, Kunnathunadu, Paravoor, Kothamangalam, Kochi, Muvattupuzha) in Ernakulam District, Kerala. In addition to government and aided schools, the campaign also focused on tribal children, fisher folk children, deaf & blind children.

### **Objective of the campaign**

**Supporting children, parents and teachers for easy reintegration to schools through safety adherence and emotional support.**

### **Components of the campaign**

1. Awareness videos of 1 minute each featuring cartoon/superhero characters providing facts and information about the safety protocols were followed at school and homes with the logos of CSL, MM and ROR, RCSS, and also promoted through Social Media and inaugurated and published on 30.10.2021 through medias.

2. Awareness videos on 'precautionary tips' from the experts such as mental health professionals, doctors, teachers etc., to ensure healthy practices and hygiene measures with the logos of CSL, MM and RCSS through social media, was screened on 01.11.2021.
3. Masks and Sanitizer distribution among the school children and motivated them to use it further. Live demo sessions were also given class wise for proper usage of masks and sanitizers.
4. 'Happiness booths' were set up in schools during the days of campaign in which children (age from 10 years) could visit to get the support from mental health counsellors.

### **Strategies (Keeping the Safety Protocols)**

- The awareness videos were shown as mobile theatres through schools.
- The schools were selected by the project team and the permission was taken to do the campaign for a time during the day.
- Masks and sanitizers were distributed class wise and the demo was done class wise while distributing the same.
- Happiness booths were set up as a temporary arrangement during the campaign time (2 hours in a school) which was announced in the class.

## **Kaval Project – Psychosocial Support for Children in Conflict with Law**

### **Lockdown activities**

- Provided food kit and other support for one of our children's family when they were in quarantine. Kaval team contacted Asha worker and arranged food kit and provided necessary support for them (25/5/2021).
- Provided food kit and other support for one of our children's family at lockdown period with the support of political parties (16/6/2021).
- On 6/5/2021, Kaval Team attended a state level meeting of ICPS with NGO directors, LCPOs, Kaval Coordinators and Case Workers from every district at 11 AM. The meeting had mainly focused on the suicidal tendency among children. ICPS had conducted a study among Kaval children as part of their study about suicides among children. The authorities have discussed the results of the study in the meeting.
- Attended Observation Home Management Committee Meeting on 06/05/2021 through Google meet.
- Had an online meeting with Kaval State Coordinator, NGO Coordinators and Case Workers of both Kaval team of Ernakulam, to discuss the lockdown activities for vulnerable children in Kaval in Ernakulam district.(26/5/2021)
- Given legal support to one of our children as he was working in a company, the police officers were planning to visit there which was a threat to his job. Kaval team interfered in the issue as soon as his mother informed the critical situation to the Kaval team. And with the support of police team we have solved the issue on 7/6/2021.
- Conducted a session for Internship students about Observation Home and its function. The session led by OH Counselor Adv. Viju Rajesh on 14/6/2021.
- Conducted a session for internship students about DCPU and its functions. The session was taken by Adv. Kiran, LCPO Ernakulam on 14/6/2021.
- Rajagiri outREACH Kaval initiated to prepare a magazine to reveal the talents of Kaval children and also to motivate the children during the lockdown period. Magazine preparation is in process and it will be published as soon as possible.
